Cobb & Co again graces Gundiah

For over 70 years horse drawn 'Cobb and Co' coaches travelled over millions of kilometres of unmade outback roads to provide vital communication links for many isolated communities.

Nowhere was its influence so widespread as in Queensland, where the company operated horse-drawn coaches from 1866 until succumbing to the motor vehicle in 1924.

As part of Queensland's 150th anniversary, the Fraser Coast Show Society presents an historic Cobb & Co Coach tour following the original coach route from Kilkivan to Maryborough. Over two days and sixteen (16) legs of the journey there will be re-enactments, traditional fare and live entertainment while covering dense bushland, dirt roads, iron bark ridges, historic bridges and stopping at historic country pubs and properties.

"The length of the legs depends on the terrain and finding a suitable place to changeover people and horses" said Gary Jensen, President of the Fraser Coast Show Society.

Highlights of the trip include the drive over the Dickabram bridge and a barbecue lunch with live entertainment by Karen Thompson at the Theebine Pub. Later that day, passengers will be first hand witnesseses to a mock hold up followed by a spit roast at the Gundy Pub on Saturday night. The Gundy Pub stop promises to be a very lively one with music by "Stockade" and bush poetry by "That Bloke".

Local History

Coach routes began and ended at a depot; along the routes were inns or change stations at regular intervals where fresh horses replaced tired ones. The original Prince Alfred Hotel, 1868, and was a 'Wayside Inn' on the coach route between Maryborough & Gympie'. Courier Mail 10/6/1869 refers to a horse stolen from the Cobb & Co stables at Gootchie by a suspected murderer. CM 13/7/1875: reports rains affecting the area, with the Cobb&Co Coach broken down at Gootchie and mail arriving by horseback at Gympie.

My old home town lies buried 'neath so many yesterdays Only barely visible, as through a dusty haze


Like a far off point on the long straight track stretching out behind Distorted by heatwaves, the dust, the distance of my mind.


