Kids, Bikes, Busy Bridges

Our children have been getting to school at Gundiah by horse, foot, bus or bicycle for over a hundred years.

It is not a new complaint that the one lane bridge over Gutchy Creek is dangerous for pedestrians and cyclists. However, in the last few years, traffic has considerably increased. There have been estimates of around 50 trucks a day, and that does not include the commute, local and general vehicle traffic.

Gavin Rock who lives right next to the bridge voiced his concern for school children's safety when he witnessed a vehicle heading north fail to see a student crossing the bridge by bicycle. Luckily, the vehicle was able to stop only feet from the student."The problem is that we have a blind corner and drivers are not looking out for kids, they are looking for cars coming in the opposite direction. Even at 40kmh they come so fast it is hard for the kids to get across the bridge once they have committed,"he said.

"I was so scared I couldn't move," said

Stephen Tracey, 9yrs.

"Bicycle safety is stressed at the school, and all cyclists wear helmets," said Ms Ellen, Gundiah State School Principal, "but I am still concerned. The council has been asked to maintain the bikeway on School Road, but we don't have a viable solution for the children crossing the bridge."

Parents have suggested solutions from increased signage, flashing lights before and after school, lollipop ladies, increased police surveillance to pedestrian bridges and widening the bridge to two lanes. All this costs money, and our community is too small to justify the expense on a political level.

It hasn't been for lack of asking either. Joanne Coyne said that there were letters and calls to the appropriate powers when her children were at the school 20 years ago, but nothing has been done about the bridge.

"What it will take, is a death or serious accident for anyone to take notice," said Graham Cash, "and then it will be too late."

With fewer and fewer people with firearms at the ready and stringent restrictions on smaller acreages ability to lay poison baits these dogs are getting out of hand.

Over the last few months Graham has shot eight feral dog/dingo's on his Gundiah property alone. For those residents that may be unaware the Fraser Coast Council offer a \$40 bounty on wild dog/dingo scalps that are shot or trapped in the shire.

Gundiah Railway Station (pictured above, circa 18??) in the news 126 yrs ago: September 11, 1883. Brisbane Courier Mail. (BCM) "A bookmaker named Moss, a defaulter from the Gympie races, was waylaid by several backers at the Gundiah railway station today and severely thrashed. He then paid up.' September 24, 1883. BCM. "A saloon compartment of the train was taken possession of today at Gundiah station by a stalwart drunken man, who defied all efforts to dislodge him, and kept possession until the train reached Maryborough, where he was arrested after a struggle". Also in October 1883, there was a train derailment at Gundiah - no casualties. There was never a dull moment in Gundiah!
