

Local ANZAC heroes live on. One of the many names on Gundiah Community Hall's Roll of Honour; James Cargill Groundwater, owes his life to his lucky wallet.

Serving in the 42nd Battalion in France during World War I, Jim Groundwater of Tiaro, kept a wad of postcards, photos and letters in his wallet in his breast pocket as was the habit of those in the trenches. Letters received were often written on the back with indelible pencil and returned.

While on the Somme fronts, a bullet penetrated the leather, photos and his pay book, but left him unscathed. Hence'lucky'he was.

But the story of the Lucky Wallet does not end there. James married Margaret Sinclair Jamieson from Netherby and took up land at Monto. Then came the second war and his neighbour's son, Lou Evans, enlisted in the airforce. He was assigned as tailgunner on Lancaster Bombers. Jim gave Lou his wallet for good luck. Lou Evans survived 43 missions over Germany and Holland. Not a light feat, when the average missions was 7 for an aircraft and 3 for a tailgunner. He religiously took his 'lucky wallet' with him. After Jim's death, Lou returned the wallet to the Groundwater family.

In the grey dawn 37 years ago this nation came of age. It happened on a beach at Gallipoli.






