The FCRC has been advised its federal grant application was successful for the development of the Tiaro Medical Centre. Federal funds of \$319,000 have been awarded. Consequently, the additional \$98,000 originally tagged by the Tiaro Shire, and subsequently FCRC, may not be required. FCRC is consulting with local doctors. Funds are yet to be transfered, final plans submitted for approval, tenders called etc., before the works can begin, however, the Council expects that the Centre should be finished early next year.


MORNING TEA @ GOOTCHIE.

Once, when there was no such thing as 'take-away'...

The average diet has changed quite a lot for most of us in this area from 70 years ago. Audrey Ward (nee Sorrensen) grew up here during the war years. Here is her version of 'what we ate and how we cooked'.

"Dad always had a veggie garden and grew cabbages and tomatoes without grubs with no dusts or sprays like we use today. Mum used to make marmalade from our orange tree and we stewed our green peaches and ate them with cream. We always had a house cow for fresh milk and had hens for eggs, sometimes the swaggies (men looking for work) would pinch the eggs if we were late picking them up and would light a fire at the Rossendale Tennis Courts to cook them.

Dad had donated that land and carted ant beds to form the court, once when dad was going to be late home from working on the court Mum decided to kill a rooster for Sunday Dinner. Unfortunately she did not chop hard enough and it went hurtling down the hill with Mum in full pursuit.

In the wartime Dad got a job in the railway at Tiaro as a Fettler, or Lizard as they were called in those days, so we moved to Tiaro railway yard and lived in 2 tents separated by a fly, one for the

kitchen and the other the bedroom, you soon got used to the trains passing by, but food was becoming scarce, beans became a rarity so Dad cut the young tender pumpkin leaves and Mum topped and tailed them and that was our'beans'. Tasted OK.

Sometimes when an American Troop Train was passing they would throw us a tin of potato similar to spud whip much darker but it tasted OK, the Americans also gave us a tins of sugar coated candies.

Dad would catch us some Perch from the creeks, Bony Bream fish from the railway lagoon where the water was pumped for the steam trains or eels from the Mary River.

The perch were cooked as fish are today; bony bream and eels were skinned and boiled then partly deboned and minced and made into fish cakes."

Does that sound anything like nuggets or a quarter-pounder meal deal to you?


