

Jiaro's Sone-Our Salute to the Diggers John Alexander Henderson



"Waiting Dreams" JA Henderson. Syria. Is there no peace– did not our other dead, Purchase it to make fair domain, Where men could dream of greater things ahead, And set another star, and march again? That is freedom. We must turn aside To guard the path for those who follow on, We!–Who knows? Perhaps our dreams will guide The eager marching when the strife is gone.

Born 23 Nov, 1914 at Shorncliffe, John Alexander Henderson, known as Alex, (pronounced 'Alick') was the son of Company Sergeant-Major Bob Henderson & Lizzie (nee Kane). At age 11, they moved to Tiaro where his father took the position of Night Officer at the railway. Alex developed a quiet strength as a lad, was a keen athlete, proficient horseman, and a kind and loving brother. His story, written by his youngest brother Eric, tells of this fearless protector with a generous and caring heart, a hero to his brothers, a hard worker, leader, avid reader and poet.

Alex was an apprentice window-dresser in Brisbane and a farm hand on a cattle station at Gayndah for 3 years. He returned to Maryborough where he obtained work 'napping stones'. At 19, he worked at the Bauple Sugar Mill. He studied to become a 3rd class steam engine driver and became sweethearts with Winifred Waldock. They later married in 1936 when they were both 21.

He continued working at the Mill, but also joined the part-time Citizens Military Force. He and Winnie had two girls in quick succession. Soon after his son Alwyn was born in 1940, Alex had enlisted in the 2/25th Battalion AIF as a permanent soldier. Winnie was decimated at being left to care for her two young daughters and baby son. Grandmother Henderson helped Winnie face the loneliness and hardship.

Alex's CMF training ensured his early promotion to Corporal. His physique and keen interest saw him win numerous bouts as welterweight boxer. Sailing for Ceylon with the 2/25th Battalion on the Queen Mary in 1941, his letters told of shipboard yarns but did not hide his concern for his little family.

Within 6 weeks of his sailing, notification was received that Cpl. J.A. Henderson was missing in action. Later, advice was received that he had been killed instantly with two of his men by crossfire against Free French Forces at Merdjaoun in Syria on 19 June 1941. His platoon commander had been killed about half an hour prior and Alex took up the challenge, advancing successfully only to be cut in two by a hidden machine gun.

Along with 69 Queenslanders, Alex received a "Mention in Despatches" for Outstanding Bravery. In 1991, Tiaro's War Memorial also acknowledged the sacrifice of Tiaro's WWII Servicemen with a plaque commemorating those who shall not grow old... Winnie Kernovske, Alex's widow, planted a Galipoli pine at the ceremony.

Once again the Ergon Energy Catch and Release Fishing competition has resulted in good news stories for local families.

Caleb Walker couldn't believe his change of luck on Sunday afternoon when his Registration number was drawn for the Ergon Energy \$1,000 cheque. The weekend started off rather badly for Caleb. He was embarrassed when he learnt that he didn't have enough cash in his wallet to cover for the full price of his Entry fee into the Tiaro Landcare Catch and Release Fishing competition. The organisers trusted him to pay the balance later. Things didn't get any better on Saturday afternoon. While fishing, a barb from a fork-tailed catfish pierced his hand and broke off; which required a visit to the Accident & Emergency at the Maryborough Base Hospital. In true fishing spirit of never giving up; Sunday morning saw Caleb back at Petrie Park with the balance of his Entry fee and ready to try his luck again at catching the right fish. While his catch wasn't the secret weight, he landed the big one when his Registration number was announced by James Hansen.

Eight different fish species were weighed-in. Andrew Frey weighed in an exceptional catch, a 4.165kg forktailed catfish with a good sized bass lodged deep in its throat.

Members of the Borumba Fishing Club passed on their knowledge to the youngsters with Learn to Fish clinics and were impressed with the fishery of the local reach of the Mary.

Entries were up on last year with numerous prizes awarded to Juniors and Seniors. The Betts-Bailey family from Brisbane took home the Tiaro Meats & Bacon Family prize a \$100 meat tray and fishing combos for the younger family members.

What's happening at Tiaro Landcare

An exhibition opening December 2nd, entitled "Exclusive & Elusive" will be on show in Gallery 2 at Gatakers ArtSpace all month.

It includes a variety of exhibits, one being lifesize images (1.7m long) of the giants of the Mary River. Admission is free and everyone is invited to visit.

Funding. Mohammed bin Zayed Species Conservation Fund advised that they are very happy to continue funding our Mary River turtle conservation work for the current season. This fund focuses on conservation of species which are internationally listed as threatened. We are very thankful for their interest and support. Since the beginning of October we have protected 45 nests.

Working for You

Bruce Highway Upgrade. We are continuing our campaign for the Qld Main Roads Dept's upgrade to the Bruce Highway through Tiaro, to include a traffic light to control pedestrian crossing and traffic flow at the 4 way intersection of the Highway and the Mungar Road.

The Department has not calculated that nearly ALL traffic using the new Medical Centre will have to turn at this intersection, nor has the Minister responded to our invitation to bring his mother and his grandkids with him and try crossing the highway a few times.

Main Roads is planning to place a "pedestrian refuge" (essentially a painted pad) in the middle of the Highway. The "refuge" does NOT have to be observed by any vehicle. Pedestrians using the "refuge" therefore do not have any rights and accept all the risks if they attempt to cross the Highway.

Medical Centre Delays. The Medical Centre it is still not finished more than 12 months after receiving the funding. This is the most important piece of infrastructure ever for our region. Why has Council not even appointed a medical practice to operate the centre nearly 13 months after receiving the funding? Council has many questions to answer, but, more importantly, Council MUST get itself into gear and have our Medical Centre opened. The promised medical services are *essential* for our region.

Music Festival. It was amazing to see a sea of mobile homes, vans and tents literally covering every nook, cranny and blade of grass at the Munna Rec Ground for the Music Festival. The enthusiasm and dedication of the new Committee to renovate one of our few remaining regional heirlooms into the absolutely rocking venue of the Music Festival is impressive. My congratulations on a magnificent result and a job bloody well done. *Darryl Stewart. Pres.*


