Tiaro's long awaited pharmacy is open for business, promising pharmaceuticals at prices that compete with Woolworths & Coles, and an attitude of 'we aim to please'.

Open since 11 March, but with signage, some shelving and EFTPOS still to be installed, Tiaro Pharmacy is eager to assist its customers.

Pharmacist Fazel Tim is no stranger to opening small rural pharmacies aimed at identifying and serving the local community's needs. "We need a little time to get to know what our community wants in both over-the-counter and prescription medicines so that we can supply them readily, keep our stock moving and the prices competitive," said Mr Tim. "Our staff are ready to help you, so *please* ask us, email or call us to check if we have the stock. We will make every effort to have supplies in the very short term."

Hours. Situated in the former Tea & Coffee House, the pharmacy is open Monday to Friday from 9am–5pm. The store is closed during lunch 1-2pm.

**Stock.** The pharmacy carries good quality generic and some brand items, no gift or photographic lines, but do offer good discounts and specials. Offers included Paracetamol 100s for \$2.50, and Dishwashing Liquid at \$2.50litre.

**Prescriptions.** eScripts are not available at present. Repeat prescriptions phoned into Monsour clinic will be dropped off at Tiaro Pharmacy at the end of each day. In most cases they will be ready for collection the following morning. Again, if you are filling your prescription at Tiaro for the first time, it might pay to call, fax or email ahead to allow time to order in the appropriate medications.


**Flu Clinic.** Customers can register for Flu Vaccine at \$30 per person. 20 places are available, but hurry.

## **ANZAC DAY FACTS**

- •ANZAC stands for Australian and New Zealand Army Corps. The soldiers in those forces quickly became known as ANZACs, and the pride they took in that name endures to this day.
- •ANZAC Day marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.
- •The Australian and New Zealand forces landed on Gallipoli on 25 April, meeting fierce resistance from the Ottoman Turkish defenders. What had been planned as a bold stroke to knock Turkey out of the war quickly became a stalemate, and the campaign dragged on for eight months. At the end of 1915 the allied forces were evacuated, after both sides had suffered heavy casualties and endured great hardships.
- •The Allied Gallipoli casualties included 21,255 from the UK, an estimated 10,000 from France, 8,709 from Australia, 2,721 from New Zealand, and 1,358 from British India.
- •During the 1920s ANZAC Day became established as a national day of commemoration for the 60,000 Australians who had died during the war. In subsequent years the meaning of the day has been further broadened to include Australians killed in all the military operations in which Australia has been involved.
- Tiaro RSL holds a Dawn Service at 6am on ANZAC Day to remember local men and women who have served our country. LEST WE FORGET...

## Objection to Electoral Division

**Electoral Unrest.** After the majority decision by Council to recommend that a divisional election be held in 2012, the members of the Tiaro and District Chamber of Commerce, after robust discussion, voted unanimously that an undivided electorate be retained in the Fraser Coast for the next Local Government election.

Accordingly, the members sent a letter to all Fraser Coast Councillors outlining their concern, the disadvantages to the rural communities, the irregularities of their vote, and requesting them to reconsider the issue.

Red deer (Cervus elaphus) are a Class 2 Declared pest in Queensland and property owners/managers are required to control their numbers. This can be successfully managed with recreational hunting.

The impending arrival of bigger Qantaslink aircraft to service the Fraser Coast has been welcomed by the Fraser Coast Mayor Mick Kruger.

"Tourism is a very important sector of our economy so anything that helps bring more people to the region is very welcome, especially as we reinvigorate the industry following the recent floods and Cyclone Yasi."

Qantaslink announced that it will add about 5,000 seats across a range of Queensland regional routes including Hervey Bay, with the arrival of another new flagship Bombardier Q400 aircraft from 6 April 2011.

"The Fraser Coast will gain an extra 604 seats per week, an increase of 30%, with more services operated by the new 74-seat Q400 jet-like aircraft."


## **P&C News**

## **Down Memory Lane**

## The Lone White Horse

MIVA HOMESTEAD 150YRS 1861-2011

The original leaseholder of the Miva area was Mr. E. Scott of Ipswich. Little is known of Mr. Scott or the date he took it up. We do know the lease was then obtained by the Gigoomgan partnership in the 1850s, but up to the time that John Townsend Atherton took over the property in 1861, it had not been put to any use. The land was totally isolated, wild and undeveloped but considered the finest cattle country with natural advantages for the fattening of cattle.

The native population were fairly numerous and the area that Atherton settled was part of the Kabi Kabi tribal lands. They called the country Bunji Bunji - home of the flying squirrel (sugar glider).

John Townsend Atherton. Mr Atherton, was 24, born in Wiltshire, England, and a son of a lawyer BUT in the 7 years he had been in Australia had demonstrated such a great aptitude for working with stock and in pastoral matters generally, that he felt confident to go out on his own. (He had first worked as a "generally useful" at Runnymede Station and then a "stockman", entrusted to manage Miriam Vale Station in the owners absence.)

A Fair Sum. Atherton took up the aggregation of leases which included what is known as South Munna Junction, Miva and Euro for £520. He called the property 'Miva' after the local Kabi Kabi tribe's name for a lone white horse. (Another story describes the horse as 'an old grey mare' that had perhaps strayed into the area, and the Kabi Kabi had never seen before, regarding it with some awe.)

Methinks' Miva' a very fitting name as it reflects also the situation John Atherton found himself in; a lone white man in the wilderness and a creature of 'awe' to the natives. This great man continued on to tame the land, building roads, the homestead, storeroom, a dairy, blacksmith's shop, stockyards etc., leaving a legacy of strength and determination to his children. He was greatly respected by the Kabi Kabi, many lived and worked at Miva Homestead.

**Miva Homestead** is *still* in the Atherton family, *still* primarily a cattle property, and *still* a rich and abundant land: 'The Crown' in Atherton's words. *There are many more tales to tell...*
