



GUNDY PUB RE-OPENS!

The locals are already warming up The Prince Alfred Hotel for it's official re-opening on Saturday, June 11th.

It has been a long time coming, but finally the licensing is in place, the floors and walls are scrubbed, painted and shining, the beer is cold and all is ready for Gundiah's historic pub to re-open.

The original Prince Alfred Hotel, 1868, was a 'Wayside Inn' on the Cobb&Co coach route between Maryborough & Gympie. It was owned by Charles Henry Scarrott and was situated in the paddock behind the current caravan park. At least two buildings later, we now have the existing pub, with the same liquor license, safely transferred to the new owners-business partners, Dan Hourigan and Renelle Russell.

The Prince Alfred Hotel had been in receivership since September 2010. The new owners, as well as past patrons of the Gundy Pub, look forward to renewing the camaraderie and spirit of years gone by.

Kitchen Open. Renelle is starting out with good basic menu including Hamburgers, Steakburgers, Rump & TBones all from Tiaro Meats, with all the veges, salads and sides, bar snacks etc. She aims to please and wants to know your favourites. Just ask.

Maryborough is the current world record holder for most people on a pub crawl with more than 4700 official crawlers in 2009. The city is aiming for the last time to beat its own record in 2011.

Fraser Coast Regional Councillor Debbie Hawes says the crawl for a cause theme for this year's costume carnivale is"We Can Be Heroes", and crawlers are encouraged to dress as their favourite hero in orange to raise money for State Emergency Services.

"To be counted for the crawl, you need to buy a crawl card either before the event from the Maryborough City Hall VIC or on the day, and get it stamped at each of the 10 participating pubs when you buy a non-alcoholic or alcoholic drink,"Cr Hawes said.

"And we like to promote the importance of designated drivers who do not drink alcohol as they are an important part of the Pub Fest. Designated drivers are entitled to FREE soft drinks at all pubs between 11am and 6pm."

Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes, and **you could win \$1000** in prize money for entering your fully stamped crawl card into the draw. Free crawl buses will be available to transport participants between the pubs.

Roadworks. Rain has still held up much of the proposed road works in the Shire. It is still too wet to do the final seal etc on some of the roads, while the maintance crews are still flat out on flood damage works.

Rose Keliher 1913-2011

After ninety-seven years the district has lost another golden oldie.

Rose May Keliher (nee Wright), born 1913 Rosewood Qld, began work at the age of sixteen as cook and housekeeper at the **Theebine Hotel**. In the 1930's Theebine was a bustling railway intersection with people and freight passing through up to Wondai and Proston or on to Maryborough and beyond. She told stories of the hours of drudgery that involved keeping that big wooden building clean; laundering sheets and linen for the hotel in primitive conditions and the work that went into cooking to meet the demands of a busy hotel dining room.

Later, she was asked if she would go to **Gootchie Homestead** to support Cate, wife of Jeremiah Keliher, after the sudden death of their 24 year old son, Tom. Rose became a companion, helper and friend to everyone in that familytheir children; Johanna, Miah, Lal, Jim and Vince; Aunts, Uncles and cousins.

Love Blossoms. Rose married Jeremiah Patrick Keliher (Miah) in St Brigid's Church, Rosewood in 1936 and they established their first home on the banks of **Deagon's Creek** at Kanighan. (This was later to be the home of Frank and Eileen Keliher. Their daughter Pauline Irwin lives there still.)

Then they moved the first old Keliher family home on **Keliher's Creek** out to **Robin Hill**, east of Kanighan. This property is now part of the Arborten Road development.

Family. Rose & Jeremiah's son Terence was born in August 1937. He was followed by two little sister's Carmel and Bernice (who died at birth), Patrick in March 1943, Kevin in May 1946, Carol Anne in 1948 and Leo in 1950.

She was a great caterer, seamstress, a generous and hospitable hostess and good fun to boot. Her fundraising efforts for the construction of the little Catholic Church at Gunalda are part of the family legends. Wherever folk sang or danced, gathered together for community and social events, Rose & Miah Keliher were part of the team.

Young Widow. In 1951, Rose lost her mate. She ceased to be a young wife living in a fairly remote country home caring for her husband and family and became a widow with little money and five children to rear on her own.

Rose moved to Gympie and created a new home that was always overflowing with relatives on their way to or from Gootchie or Kanighan.

She never forgot her connections with the region. Family celebrations and funerals bought her back to the district on a very regular basis until her early 90s. At her own funeral she was farewelled by her family, many old friends from Gunalda such as the Balkins from Gunalda and Kunst family from Miva whose friendship with the Keliher family goes back three generations.

Her connection with this district that she loved will go on for a very long time now. She left this life on 10 March 2011 and is buried in Tiaro with her husband Jeremiah Patrick. She is at rest with many friends and relatives, back home in this particularly beautiful part of the Mary River valley. *by Carol Keliher. Read the full Eulogy at gundiahgazette.com.au*



Tiaro's Sons. (Continued from May 2011.) Private Stanley Walter Ashton Q24629

Pictured far right, Stanley Walter Ashton was born at Yerra on 15th June 1909, the only son Christopher and Anne Ashton (nee Sorrensen). He had 3 younger sisters and went to school at Myrtle Creek. When his mother died in 1924, he moved to Bauple and worked various jobs, helping his father in the cane industry and carting cane to the Bauple mill for several of the local farmers.

A member of the Presbyterian Church, he was highly respected in the Tiaro and Bauple districts.

Stan enlisted in the Army 1941 and was sent to New Guinea with the 47th Infantry Battalion. While on duty around Lake Salus area, Stan and 6 others were killed by a large Japanese raiding force. Also killed with Stan that day were 2 other soldiers of the Gympie district, being, Corporal D.H Day and Pte H.A.W Brown.

His death on the 14th August, 1943, aged 34 years, was a sad loss to his family, fiancée and friends. He is buried in the Lae cemetery at Salamaua.
