## **RSL fundraising makes life simpler**

Almost a year of fund-raising came to fruition when the Ebert family had an electric wheelchair hoist fitted to the family four-wheel-drive in January. Jointly, the Gundy Pub, and Tiaro RSL Sub-branch raised \$6,000 to purchase and have the hoist in-stalled.

Mrs Ebert told us that when the installers demonstrated how easy the electric hoist was to operate, she broke into tears. When asked why she was crying, she said they had no idea how this simple device would make life so much easier for the whole family.

"I used to have to disassemble the battery and seat to be able to lift the wheelchair into the car," she said.

"Now, with the use of the sling and hoist all I have to do is press a couple of buttons."

Gorja is the only person in Queensland, on one of only a few in Australia, who

suffers from the rare muscle-wasting disease Nemaline Myopathy. She also suffers from Scoliosis and Osteoporosis. Mr and Mrs Ebert said they were humbled by the generosity of the public and particularly thanked the owners of the Gundy Pub, Renelle and Dan, for all the work they had put into raising the money.

**Tiaro RSL Sub-branch** is a notfor-profit organisation whose aim it is to assist veterans, war widows and their dependants, work with the youth of our area and to generally uphold and improve the excellent name the RSL enjoys throughout Australia.

## Kanighan or Kanigan?

One of our readers rang the office and told us we had a mistake in our February issue as we had spelled 'Kanighan' wrong.

Well, this to many readers, is not a new subject and my old mate Ian Brown and Norris Blair would pull you over the coals, then tar and feather you, if you pronounced or spelt it wrong. Kanighan (pronounced Kà-nine) vs Kanigan (Kà-nì-gàn).

It appears various clans from the area could not explain which one was right. We thought it might be a good idea if we did some research to find out just who was right, so we asked local historian Lillian Coyne to find out. She turned the museum upside down, paper and books everywhere and all she did was confuse herself. In fact, I thought a good double sherry may be the order of the day to calm her nerves as when I was summoned to the museum for the results I noted she had even taken her shoes off – what pressure this assignment was!

We then took the next step and thought the computer might tell us. Well that was as bad, some stories and articles use the different spellings, in some cases in the same story! (That's covering yourself!) But bingo, we hit the jackpot in the Government archives:

Kanighan School (No761) changed its name to Kanigan School in 1946; the school was started on the 26/1/1892 and closed 30/3/1959. This is noted in the Queensland State Archives Agency ID5933

The only thing it didn't tell us is "WHY?" SO, come on readers, let's hear your stories of why the change, I'm sure one of the pioneering families of the district would have the information stored away. *Trevor Keightley* 4129 2504

## Down Memory Lane Life on the Farm at River View

I was born at the Maryborough Hospital. My Mother and I returned back to the farm which was named River View via Gundiah, as the house was built over-looking the Mary River.


When I was school age, all of us kids, along with Colin Gilchrist, John Thompson, Marjory, June, Daphne and Des Lamke, would all gather at River View. My Father would then row us across the Mary in a boat, mornings and afternoons, as Deborah School was across the River. At times when the water rose too high, he would not cross the river. When I left the Deborah School was closed for good. Some children went to Gundiah School. I can still remember the cane around my legs for doing the wrong things.

My main jobs on the farm were to milk some cows, feed calves, pigs, and fowls. After milking, I had to clean up around the milking shed. I chopped wood for the stove upstairs, and for the boiler for washing clothes downstairs. I also helped my mother around the house, while my Father and 2 brothers worked on the farm to grow vegies and green feed for the animals.

At times, I had to ride my bike about 15 miles to Gundiah for mail, bread and odd things for the house. When I was old enough, I bought a motor-bike when I joined the Gundiah Cricket Club. Cricket was played behind the Hartvigsen's Store, and the late Mark Thompson was our Captain.







During the War, many soldiers camped and did training on a big slope at the back of our property. Army planes flew over the tree tops and would bomb the soldiers with bags of white stuff. The soldiers took most of our cream, milk, watermelons, pumpkins and vegies. My Father got paid from the government much later.


It was long hours and tough work those days, with horses taking the place of machinery, but it was a good clean life. My brothers got married and I left the River View farm about 1944.


### Tiaro Farming & Lifestyle Field Day





## Deeming rate cut

13 February 2013 Federal MP Warren Truss welcomed the deeming rate reduction, following his calls for the Government to do so. (Deeming rates determine how much pensioners receive under the means testing rules.)

The rate will fall from 3% to 2.5% for the first \$45,400 of financial investments for single pensioners and the first \$75,600 for couples, and reduced from 4.5% to 4% for amounts over those thresholds. Single Age Pensioners may invest up to \$115,825/year, and couples will be able to invest up to \$202,550/year before losing some of their pension if their only source of income is from financial investments.

"Some pensioners will now receive a higher Age Pension, and others will now qualify for the Age Pension for the first time."
