# Men's Shed Open Day

Tiaro RSL Sub-branch officially presented a \$3,900 wood thicknesser machine to the Bauple Community Shed during its public open day on Saturday April 6. The new thicknesser was installed in the 'green shed' — a separate building which is solar and battery powered and not connected to the electricity grid.

Making the presentation, the President of the RSL Sub-branch, Graeme Davis, said the Community Shed had come a long way since the first sod was turned back in 2008. It was opened for use the following year. The main building was funded by a Department of Veterans'Affairs grant, and since then other grants and donations from the local community have seen the facility grow in size and popularity.

Today the facility comprises metalwork and a woodwork areas, a kitchen-tea room, toilet and shower and an officecomputer room in the main building. A second workshop is being established in the "green shed". The open day was a great success with many members attending, as well as a good response from the public. *Pete Kelly 4129 6270*

# We need Trees II

**Captain Cook** first sailed up the East Coast of Australia in 1770 and holed his ship on the Barrier Reef. He landed at what is now named Cooktown to repair the damage. On his next voyage to Australia in 1774 his secret orders included finding timber suitable for ships masts.

Increasing population, together with The Bronze Age and Iron Age-when forests were destroyed to produce charcoal to melt the mineral ores and make metal-meant that Great Britain was short on timber to make sailing ships. As ships were the means of world exploration and discovery, leading to colonization and settlement throughout the world. Lack of timber was a national crisis. It made the Brits dependant on Scandinavian countries supplying particularly long lengths for masts, and the Empire was in fear of the other colonial powers-France, Spain, Holland and Russia-blockading this supply. They looked for an alternative resource hence Cook's secret orders on his second voyage. He first looked at timber from Norfolk Island & New Zealand. While this timber was straight, it was not strong enough for masts. He sailed west to the southern coast of Victoria and via today's Lakes Entrance, was able to harvest samples of Vic Mountain Ash, in the foothills of the Great Dividing Range. This site, near present day Bairnsdale, was named Mast Gully. It is still known by this name today, though most people are not aware of the origin of its name.

**The Mountain Ash** is a eucalypt, and it is also the tallest flowering plant in the world. Eucalypts are a dense, strong, adaptable timber, which because of its inherent strength, generally have much less width in relation to their height. Softwoods need a greater width for support, with some of the largest Red Woods measuring 8 metres across the base, (remembering they are 2 to 3 thousand years old where as the termites and bushfires ensure most Aussie trees do not become too old).

Marine ship building required properties of strength, density, bending (to form ships hulls etc), adhesive bonding and preservative treatment, When the ex Governor of NSW reported back to the British authorities in 1807 he commented that our Aussie timbers "were equal to any timber in the world" for ship building.

The Mountain Ash is described as up to 100m tall having a smooth trunk at least two-thirds the height of the tree, with no knots or faults. The self pruning nature of Eucs with the slight natural taper meant meant the logs could be cut to desired length and diameter to suit the need e.g masts.

So, we can say that timber was the first export product from Australia.

Col Bowman is a 'senior' resident of Bauple, an ex-grazier in Northern Territory & Central Queensland and claims he is no fan of Bob Hawke, has an associate degree in Forestry, is a wildlife advocate and good for a yarn.


## SES Gets Results

### Down Memory Lane "Munna" home of the pioneer Kunst family

The section of Miva district around the junction of the Munna Creek and Mary River is known as Munna Creek and is often shortened to"Munna". The Munna Creek and the Mary River had their sources many miles away; the Mary rising in the mountains near Maleny, and Munna Creek near Biggenden. Here, countless floods had deposited rich silt on the creek and river flats and a family could make a living on a few acres without much capital outlay. In many cases, a settler simply moved onto a chosen spot and began felling the scrub, giving him priority when the land was alienated from leasehold to freehold.

Munna Creek had its own school, public hall and telephone exchange but relied on Miva for supplies and postal and rail facilities.

Among the earliest pioneers of this area were the Kunst brothers who came from Schleswig-Holstein, walking distance of the seaport of Flensburg. The first of the brothers to emigrate was **Jacob Kunst** who came out on the sailing ship "Shakespeare" and arrived in Maryborough in 1871; he secured a small farm near Tiaro and married Miss Jane Allen who had come out from England alone as a teenager.

In 1875, his brothers **Hans** and **Henry** followed him in the Sailing ship"Isles of the South", the voyage lasting over 4 months. For some years the brothers worked around Tiaro mainly in contract fencing. In 1881, the three brothers determined

In 1881, the three brothers determined to go further afield in search of suitable agriculture land, Jacob selected a piece of land on the river not far from the Miva crossing and engaged in mixed farming. He also ran a store and a butcher's shop, later he turned to dairying, making butter and cheese on the farm and selling his products to shopkeepers in Maryborough and Gympie, getting 1/- a pound for his butter. He was also one of

the first to experiment successfully with the storage of maize in tanks. Jacob and his wife Jane raised a family of four sons and four daughters.

Hans and Henry selected land on the Munna Creek and worked the property in a partnership that lasted for 40 years. When their respective families were grown up it was dissolved by mutual consent.

In 1885, Hans returned to his native land to see his aging parents and while there he married, his tales of life and opportunities in Australia made yet another brother Fritz to come to the new land. Thus when Hans returned to Australia there came with him not only his bride but his brother with his wife and four young sons.


The new immigrants may not have been overly impressed with their adopted country at first, as a rather large pig entered the kitchen and created great havoc amongst the welcome feast.

Hans and his wife raised two daughters and five sons. In the meantime Henry Kunst married Isabella McWatters, daughter of a neighbouring farmer and raised five sons. Like other early settlers Hans and Henry grew maize and potatoes and many times lost their crops by floods.

The newest arrival **Fritz** followed the same occupation as his brothers leasing and renting farms until he obtained his

own farm further up the Munna Creek, he and his wife raised a family of nine sons and one daughter.

The four brothers and their wives were well-known and respected identities in the district and were all laid to rest in the same local cemetery. Their combined ages totalled 658 years an average of 82 years. Between them they produced twenty five sons and seven daughters–a great pioneering family of the Munna district. *From Erin Carlson's – A Century of Settlement in the Miva District.* 









He is an established Country Music recording artist with Kross Kut records, songwriter and well-known local performer. He has performed at Gundiah Hall since the 70's. Lex is also an organiser and the energy behind the Munna Creek Country Music Festival, fundraiser and lifetime member of the Flying Doctors Association. He has organised our performers and been gracious in donating his time and credibility to the Hall's 90th event. Phil Truscott and 'Family'. 
