A real Family event!

Oh what a day and night when the village of Gundiah celebrated 90 years with the Hall.

Sports and laughter. It started with a BBQ breakfast. Croquet, pool, jumping castles and darts elicited laughter and some fierce competition. Yesteryear, annual 'sports days' still continued into the 1950s in the field behind the pub, with around 300 horses competing, figure 8 races, pumpkin races, nail-driving comps for the ladies, races for the children, cow dung throwing, wood chop, stalls and icecream! (Cricket and tennis were weekly events.)

Music and Dancing. As the evening drew closer the buzz came from the old Gundiah Hall. Historical displays and afternoon tea with a lot of chin-wagging were followed by dinner and an old-time dance. Our own local legend, Lex K, had us all dancing and singing along (if we were old enough to know the words.) Backup came from the Greg Ross band. Greg is also a past resident

of the area, with his daughter Amy, 14, impressing us with her delightful voice. **Family.** The most talked about Councilor, our Phil Truscott, performed to fulfill a promise that became a fundraiser for the hall. What a lot of us did not know was he was member of the very successful group "Family" who very kindly put on a show capturing some of their past success, and a special song written for our Gundiah Hall!

90th Anniversary. The two most senior attendees Merv Jessen, 87, and Lillian Coyne, 86, cut the Anniversary cake. (Three generations of the Thompson, Keliher and Groundwater families, to name a few, attended the day with State and Federal MPs, Council officials and families from as far away as Brisbane and Rockhampton, with ring-ins from Murgon, Hervey Bay, Maryborough and a few grey nomads of no fixed address'.) **Memories, Families and History.** Owen Thompson gave a short overview of the history of the hall during dinner,

which included its founding, events and personal memories. Grazier's meetings, church services, dances and balls, weddings, Miss Tiaro Shire heats and more were held in this hall. Premier Joh Bjelke Peterson has visited. Proudly, Gundiah Memorial Hall remains publicly owned and has been built, run and maintained by the community at large.

Good time had by all. The significant outcome of the evening was the revival of good country hospitality, good music and good company. I think that it brought back good memories for some and for others it was an insight into the community spirit and a peek down the halls of history. It is thought to have been more than 30 years since a dance had been held at Gundiah, with Lex K claiming he may have played at the last one, in 1979. However, there were many requests for another soon.





I write from Butchella Country... beneath yellow stringies and black wattle blooms, by the creek. East from here through the forest, across the coastal heath, on the shores of the great Sandy Strait flows the passage to Fraser Island. On the other side of the fence somewhere up on Mount Bauple, the noisy pittas call...'walk to work', 'walk to work'.

'The other side of the Coin'

The haul is long from Frankfurt to Bauple. Two sisters, one's daughter and their tent made that haul. I wondered, what would these women take with them on return? What of Bauple would they retell to friends?

Mostly for this author it will be the musing that in all the long hauls, two sisters, one's daughter and their tent make between Bauple and Frankfurt, how many Butterfly men will they meet named Col across from a BBQ in the grounds of an Heritage Museum...

Down Memory Lane MARY SO GOODMARY SO BAD

Our mighty Mary River or Moocooboola as it was known by the aboriginal people has a mixed past. In 1842 early European explorers Andrew Petrie and Henry Russell named it the Wide Bay River. In 1847 (before separation) it changed names again being named after the wife of the then governor of New South Wales, Lady Mary Lennox. From then it was - and still is today - known as the Mary River.

The Mary was so good that day.

The Mary river has a catchment area of some 9595 square kilometres and has its origins in the Blackall Ranges west of the Sunshine Coast, about 80 kilometres north of the state capital just off the Steve Irwin Way. It flows northwards bounded by the Connondale, Jimna and Burnett Ranges passes through towns such a Kenilworth, Gympie, Tiaro, Maryborough and many smaller communities. There are any number of creeks that flow into this mighty river; creeks such as Munna, Obi Obi, Yabba, Wide Bay, Chinaman, Myrtle just to name but a few. In the vicinity of the township of Maryborough the major water flow of Tinana Creek enters the river and further eastwards the Susan River also makes an entry.

But she is not always a lady...

Reflecting back on the Australia Day weekend of 2013, mother nature chose to unleash her fury throughout the catchment area via ex-tropical cyclone Oswald, one would not fully anticipate just what was about to take place.

Oswald continued relentlessly southward, dumping rain in the Mary river catchment – the most since 1974 when Cyclone Wanda passed through producing a flood of 10.90m.

The whole of the Mary river catchment from its origins in the hinterland northward from Brisbane to Maryborough was saturated.



Gympie was cut off as the mighty Mary reached a peak of 19.45m. It wasn't long before communities such as Glenwood, Gundiah, Bauple, Tiaro and Maryborough were isolated. Maryborough was cut off from Hervey Bay. The northern centres of Aldershot, Howard and Burrum also remained isolated. Isolation brought on by the Mary or its tributaries and in particular Tinana Creek was uncontrollable.

Turmoil everywhere. The Mary River that is normally so placid was an absolute raging torrent. It rose to heights not seen in nearly 40 years, flooded homes and properties, inundated great farming and grazing land, destroyed/damaged infrastructure such as roads, power supplies, potable water supplies, telecommunications to name but a few. Erosion brought on by the intensity and force of the water of the river banks became apparent.

Disaster management. From this perspective it was a nightmare. The majority of the townships were isolated, motorists were stranded, evacuations were performed, helicopters were intermittantly available to Fraser Coast, no communications whatsoever in many locations and to exacerbate the issue power supplies were intermittent or in many places non-existent. The most poignant point was that there was no information or intelligence on just how

communities were coping—an issue the Fraser Coast Regional Council is moving to resolve for the future. A communications network through community centres right across the Council region is in process.

Thinking back about the Mary, I vividly recall a comment made to me by a long time local resident, "How bad is this?" with which he followed up with "The Mary can be so good but on the other hand the Mary can be so bad".

Aboriginal history.

The clan on the eastern side of the Mary River at Theebine-Gootchie-Gundiah and east towards Tinana Creek were called the "Ka'bi Kga'kgari". They were the "Echidna" people - the "Eaters of sweet meat". Their territory ended at a line from the Mary River-Gundiah-Mt Bauple and Mt Penny eastwards along Bauple Creek towards Tinana Creek. North of that line were the Badtjala clans - they were different people to that of the Ka'bi clans with a different language. The southern line extended from the mouth of Wide Bay Creek towards Gunalda and Sandy Creek to Tinana Creek. They are the only recorded fully cannibalistic clans of S. E. Old and were feared by all other aboriginal clans and the European settlers. They were wiped out brutally c.1866 during a raid by Tiaro stockmen in revenge for the killing and eating a man, one of their shepherds. There were no survivors for that clan.

Though turtles and tortoises have survived countless millennia, today more than half the 328 species face a very uncertain future. The Mary River turtle which can only be found in a single river is the second most threatened turtle in Australia.

Last nesting season, Tiaro Landcare members protected 32 turtle nests along the Mary River with 305 turtles successfully hatched. Recently an adult turtle was recaptured which was tagged 16 years ago in 1997. Her size hadn't changed. She'd survived many droughts and floods during that time.
