Dr Suzy Baudoeuf and her team will be moving to the Tiaro Medical Centre in the New Year. They are hoping, if all goes smoothly, to open on Monday 6th January, 2014. The telephone number will be the same: 4193 9171.

Necessary Changes. Dr Suzy told the Gazette her decision to move was based on these needed improvements:

- a central location for her patients •fasterambulanceresponse • the expectation of another doctor joining the practice in 2014, requiring a larger facility,
- better access for Allied Health.

Dr Suzy and Bopple Surgery would like to thank Mr Bromet of Macadamia House for the help and cooperation he has given them in making available a useable facility in Bauple over the last 2 years. **Council's Part.** Dr Suzy thanks Fraser Coast Regional Council for accepting Bopple Surgery's tender and facilitating their move to Tiaro. However, they are still in discussion with the council as to the parking facilities.

Planning for closure. It is anticipated that the Surgery will be closed between 23/12/2013 and 5/1/2014 to relocate."Please ensure you are covered for prescriptions in plenty of time for the Christmas break", Dr Suzy advised.

Council Pleased. Phil Truscott, Division 2 Councillor, is very pleased with the news. "This has been the result of many months of talking to several doctors to occupy the Tiaro Medical Centre," he said.


Local School Excels

A tale of a long lived Terrapin

For years thousands of turtle eggs were collected from the Mary River, hatched and sold in Pet Shops in Sydney and Melbourne during the 1960's & 70's. To our surprise, we were recently contacted by Damian from Melbourne who shared with us his family's story. In the 1970's his Mum purchased 3 'terrapins' from a local pet shop and was given instructions about their care, which she dutifully followed for about 30 years. His Mum passed away a few years ago and his inheritance included the 2 surviving terrapins'. Damian found a vet who informed him that they weren't terrapins, but were the endangered Mary River turtle and needed a much bigger aquarium than 1foot 6inches. Since then they have almost tripled in size and are very healthy. And the good news doesn't stop there. Damian's interest in the Mary River turtle has extended to supporting the conservation of wild turtles through the efforts of Tiaro Landcare. Pet turtles really do require a long term commitment, almost 40 years so far for this family. Who knows whether these turtles will become part of Damian's estate in due course?

Magnus Thomas Jamieson

Private 6823, 9th Battalion, 22nd Reinforcement

Magnus was born in Tiaro on 18 September 1892, son of John James and Catherine Jamieson of Netherby via Tiaro. His parents arrived in Maryborough in 1884 from the Shetland Islands and worked at Miva before purchasing "Netherby". There were 9 children.

Magnus was the fifth son. He attended Tiaro State School. On the completion of his schooling he became a stockman, working with his brothers on the family property.

He enlisted in the Army on the 4th August 1916 at the age of 23, leaving from Brisbane on board HMAT A74 Marathon on the 27th October 1916. He arrived at Plymouth, England on the 9th January 1917.

On 23 January 1917, while on leave in London, he wrote a lengthy letter to his Mother, in which he said "he had a nasty cough." He said the parade ground has been frozen for the past week and some of his unit have frost bitten feet.

He did not recover from his cough and in just 2 weeks after writing this letter, he died at the Fargo military hospital on the 7 February 1917. He was buried at the Durrington Military Cemetery, Wiltshire (Grave No 181) on the 12 February 1917.

Magnus died from bronchial pneumonia (Spanish flu) which accounted for thousands of allied soldiers during 1917-1918 and immediately after the war ceased.

DOWN MEMORY LANE

The Thriving township of Miva in the early 1900's

One sees frequent references to the astonishment which the pioneers would feel if they could return today to the scene of their early labours.

In Miva we like to think that our pioneers would feel very much at home. It is still a tiny township but one which serves well it's district. It consists of a general store, a railway-Station- cumpost office, a garage and sawmill. The general store, established in 1900 by Mr.

William Nahrung, provides practically everything needed for daily living ably run by Mr. Alex Nahrung and his son Colin, the store is widely known and patronized far beyond district limits. The garage is owned by Mr. F.J. Bulmer who is a skilled mechanic and in much demand when cars and tractors etc. need attention. Mr. Bulmer is also the local cream carrier, and besides transporting, regularly delivers meat, bread, groceries and the all-important mail to outlying districts. The present station mistress is Mrs. C Radel. The sawmill is owned by Fairlie and son, a Maryborough firm and is in the process of being Electrified, electricity having been switched on in Miva in this Centenary year (1959).

The Township also boasts a thriving CWA. The first meeting of the branch was held on the 4th April 1928. The first President was Mrs. G, W. Nahrung; the secretary was Mrs. P. W. Kraft and the treasurer Mrs. A. W. Nahrung. Mrs. Alex Nahrung was instrumental in establishing a branch of the Red Cross which now has a membership of 74. This year for the 5th time the Branch doubled its quota payment to headquarters and so again received an honors certificate.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Elizabeth Park Rose Gardens

Council has installed new interpretive signage at the Elizabeth Park Rose Gardens. The site became the town's cemetery in 1871. However, as Maryborough expanded, cottages were built around it and the council became concerned for public health. A new cemetery was registered and burials at the site ceased in 1873. In 1907, the trustees offered to move the headstones to the new cemetery to a free plot of ground. Between 1907 and 1921, the old cemetery was cleared. A total of 245 burials took place at the site, but few headstones were used as most locals could not afford the expense. The former cemetery became a public park in 1921. In 1937, Maryborough City Council and a local Rotary group officially adopted the name 'Coronation Park' to commemorate the coronation of King George VI. However to coincide with the visit of Queen Elizabeth II, Rotary had the park renamed. It was officially reopened as 'Elizabeth Park' on 5 June, 1954. Maryborough City Council decided to turn it into a rose garden in 1961 and the Paulen Park Nursery at Tinana donated 4,000 rose bushes to be planted. "The Elizabeth Park Rose Gardens demonstrate the evolution of settlement here in Maryborough,"Cr Seymour said. "The new signs really incorporate this story and I hope it inspires people to take more interest in our history."

A letter from Dossie.

Dear Sandra, Firstly I must say how much I enjoy the Gazette, who would have thought that times could change an area so much. Not many names are familiar to me now, but the venues and properties remain the same. I spoke recently with a friend from Turkey Beach who had attended the first Munna Creek Music Festival. They were disappointed to have missed the second one.

Memories. My thoughts went back to my first venture into the happy days of country music. Mr. Mervyn Kunst was at that time widely known for his singing and guitar music.

Merv tutored me on my guitar and I sang"Blue Velvet Band" and "Stockman In Uniform". This concert was held in the Munna Creek Hall, early 1950's. Many nights of fun and entertainment were had in the halls about the district. Gundiah was a favourite too.

Tiaro Tomboy. I was born in Tiaro and educated at the Tiaro State school. On leaving, being somewhat of a tomboy, I was offered the choice of high school in Maryborough or go as "Sidie" to my Dad on the timber trucks. My father was a timber hauler for 35 years to Wilson Hart Sawmill in Maryborough. Mick Dale was a well known contractor hauling logs from many properties between Gympie and Childers. So much of that area was held by the Forestry Department where selected blocks were put up for tender to fell logs to selected sizes. Some of these blocks were pretty hairy. A small"D-30 International" truck was purchased from Mr. Jack Whellan on his retirement and this was to become my work vehicle.

Mr. Squire Hansen and Mr. Stan Kajewski were the main timber cutters. Private land holders would cut logs on their properties also. My brother Garry went on to continue and expand the business on my father's retirement.

Ethel Turner. While still at school in Tiaro, I had the pleasure of music lessons from Miss Ethel Turner who would travel to Tiaro some days of the week from Gundiah on the railmotor. So many children were fortunate to have Miss Turner as their tutor in music. Miss Turner was a sister-in-law to Mr. Squire Hansen.

About two years ago I was playing with my dogs and one scratched me a little. I thought nothing of it till I got to the stairs and my foot was getting very big. Washed it in detol and did all the right things. By the time two hours passed, we had to call a ambulance. Off to Maryborough Base, then straight to Hervey Bay and straight to Brisbane that night.

I had been tired, but we are all getting a bit older. Anyway this darling Dr John Casey and Dr Cameron Curly came and told me I had APML – acute proyeloytic leukemia–a very rare and aggressive form of the disease. They started chemotherapy then and there. With APML you don't get treated by the normal chemotherapy, they had to use arsenic–five hours on the drip every day for five months, then as an out patient every day for four hours. Arsenic didn't make my hair fall out, hurray! Each month I go Brisbane and every second month I have a bone marrow aspiration in Brisbane and fortnightly blood tests up here.
