Be aware

Local Emergency. Another local Gundiah family put the emergency services to the test late February. 6yr old Oliver Westbury received a compound fracture, smashing his elbow in a gokart accident at his home.

"I want everyone to be aware that it does take a while to get help in rural areas. It doesn't occur to you until you are in the situation," said his mother, Isis.

"We had to keep Oliver still and wait. Waiting is not easy in these situations." Oliver was taken to Hervey Bay Hospital as Gympie could not accommodate him. He needed immediate surgery. The doctors wanted to send him to Brisbane but there wasn't time.

Local residents should be as prepared as possible for emergencies.

Dial 000. If the patient is critical, you might be the only lifeline until help arrives. Stay calm and follow directions from the operator.

Be aware that as many GPS systems do not recognise "Netherby Road", but only "Old Gympie Road", it is worth mentioning to the operator and could save time.

First Aid Course. It pays to keep your first aid skills up to date.





A little history – The Church was established in 1940 by the local community and was managed and maintained by them until it was handed over to the Uniting Church in 1977. Now – The Uniting Church has agreed to return the church to the local community under the management of the Theebine Hall Committee. Some may see this as a step back in time while others - coming full circle. The community is embracing this new responsibility with enthusiasm and will continue holding services on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at 10am. As in those early days an invitation is

•We now have a new organisation, Fraser Coast Opportunities, to consult with re progressing our town. Discussions commencing this month.


•After meeting with other progress associations, we are planning to work together as a combined voice for regional matters in order to progress towns in the area.

Turtle Nesting done

The turtle nesting season has come to a close with nesting numbers one of the lowest on record due to the dry spring and early summer. Thanks to funding received from the Qld Government's Everyone's Environment Grant we are able to develop curriculum material, soon to be available on our website.

"Memories" Written by Robert Jackson

These memories of Robert's life were handed down to their dear Daughter Elizabeth with love from Mum Maisie K.M.Jackson. (The Gazette will publish these memories in two parts.) I am writing this from memory of incidents which I actually saw or were told to me as authentic. I left home in my teens to join my brother in Queensland in January in 1910. I left Sydney on the S.S. Arawatta and arrived in Brisbane at 4:30pm. A steward from the ship a Mr. Middleton accompanied me to a boarding house in Ann St, Somewhere near where the school of arts now stands. I remember it because it was on a cliff about ten feet high and one had to go

up numerous steps to reach it.

There was no sewage at the time that is at the boarding house I stayed there over night next morning I caught the train at central station for Gootchie Siding. On getting on the train the first thing I noticed was that the seats went from end to end with passengers sitting with their backs to the windows. At numerous places on en route I noticed a lot of scrub country had felled and burnt off.

Some of the land had been planted in corn and some had sugar cane. The train arrived at Gympie around Midday. For lunch I had been told by my brother to keep a look out for a water tank as that was at Gootchie. So, when I saw the tank I poked my head out of the train window and saw my brother waiting. He said to wait for the train to pull up at the platform, so I got out there.

Jack had brought me a horse to ride to his place. We left my trunk to be brought out by a friend. Jack himself was riding a young chestnut but had a creamy horse for me. We set out for what was to be home for number of years. As we passed people's selections, I was told who lived there. As we crossed Gootchie Creek itself at a low level bridge there was a tree on the far bank my brother asked what sort it was. I said immediately "Silky Oak".

Strange as it may seem, it came to me that I had seen it before exactly as it appeared before me then. From there on we went up a long lane with slip rails at the end, and went through property belonging to people by the name of Schmidt. We continued on through property which I found belonged to a man known as Tiger Jones.

His slab house had been browning down in the last storm, but at the moment he was absent in Maryborough where he had two homes. Leaving the Jones property, which adjoined my brother's place, which had been run years before by the first selection. It looked like a skeleton of trees with the sun shining on them white and bare. We finally arrived at the house, which was a low set place, the height off the ground being about 1 foot. The place consisted of three bedrooms, one of which had been turned into a saddle and work room; another room you would probably class as a sitting room, dining room and kitchen, with a half verandah at the front which faced east.

As it was milking time when we arrived Jack went for the cows. Jack had started dairying and the cows had to be milked. Needless to say I was just a 'looker on' for the time being. (*continued next edition*)
