Fraser Coast Opportunities in Bauple!

The Mayor and representatives from Fraser Coast Opportunities (FCO) visited Bauple last Thursday to meet with the Bauple Progress Association (BPA) to review responsibilities for the Community Development Plan (CDP).

The Bauple CDP was the blue print used for all regional towns in the Fraser Coast region from 2010 following the Peter Kenyon's community planning workshops.

Fraser Coast Opportunities Enterprise Manager Scott Rowe and Tourism Manager Robbie Cornelius committed to working with the Bauple community to progress opportunities for the benefit of Bauple and to attract and retain more tourists in the original home of the macadamia nut.

All parties want a sustainable Bauple and discussed roadblocks to achieving targets, and were referred to the new State Government toolkit.

BPA President Yolande Bromet said that those responsibilities not accepted by FCO would therefore remain with Council. This would allow the publication of the reviewed CDP soon for interested Bauple residents; a process to

which many residents and community groups had contributed and had started in August 2013 with the previous BPA committee.

Other News. Next meeting - May 7th at the Bauple Band Hall. Guest speaker is NEW Bauple School Principal, William Snedden. Presidents from regional Progress Associations will be in attendance to speak on rate issues in their area.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Interim Satellite Service expansion to improve broadband for rural subscribers

The National Broadband Network will invest \$34 million to upgrade its Interim Satellite Service (ISS) and extend commercial satellite services to rural areas.

"The upgrade will improve ISS connection speeds for subscribers, and increase the capacity of the ISS for up to 9,000 extra users," Mr Truss said.

Each user will receive up to a third more capacity, enabling them to more reliably use the internet, email, and VOIP services during peak periods. A new subsidy scheme will allow rural households, businesses and primary producers to access commercial satellite broadband.

Safer Roads

The Maryborough region will see almost \$500,000 worth of new safety projects to tackle the road toll as part of a \$350 million state wide initiative. Some of the key local works to improve safety will include signage improvements on Bauple-Woolooga Road at Gutchy Creek (\$18,000) and wide centre line treatments on the Bruce Highway (part of a wider \$1.83 million package) "The Bauple-Woolooga Road project is set to be completed by mid-year with the Bruce Highway project being completed by the end of the year," she said.

He was killed in action on the 29th July 1916, with no known grave.

DOWN MEMORY LANE

"Memories"

Written by Robert Jackson



(Continued from March '14) Robert left Sydney in 1910, aged 16, and arrived in Gootchie by train. His adventure continues his experiences with his brother Jack on a property near Gootchie and in a totally new environment:

It was milking time when we arrived, so Jack went for the cows. Jack had started dairying and the cows had to be milked. Needless to say I was just a 'looker on' for the time being, but I learnt to milk, and helped feed the calves.

One night some weeks later I awoke and listened. Then woke up Jack and asked, "Isn't that a Dingo howling just outside?" He said "Yes!" and hopped out of bed and went to the calf paddock. There was a calf the dingo had just killed - he had torn a great hole in the flank to get at the kidneys and had been calling to his mates when I heard him.

Tiger Jones. From now on the tale I relate may not be in the right sequence as regarding when things took place, but nevertheless, it is all there.

When Tiger Jones returned to his selection, he used to come up every day to get skimmed milk. Sometimes he would have a drink of tea. When he swallowed, you could hear it go down his throat like something going down a sink.

In his hut, there was a bunk on one side and he had a remarkable table, suspended from the roof by a wire, which

was made to revolve. It was made out of a piece cut from a big pine log, about 3'6" wide and about 3" thick. When he wanted something from the other side, he simply turned the table, picked up whatever he required and let the table go - returning to its original position.

He obtained his water from a lagoon covered with water hyacinth. There was only enough opening to dip water. It did not seem to do him any harm.

About this time he decided to build himself a hut out of the remains of his old home, which had a shingle roof. He used some on his new hut which was only about 8' x 10'. He decided to use iron as a roof, which he got his neighbour on the other side to bring from the station. He set to work; put the posts in, laying them long enough to make a loft, about 4' in height which he could sleep in.

Well, to make a long story short, what does he do - put the posts in but does not allow for the length or width in lap. His iron is about a foot too short and is not wide enough after the lap. So he simply knocks the posts in at the tops and hey presto the iron covers it - does not matter if the walls have a slope and are about a foot out of plumb. It suits Jones.

On several occasions when coming home, I or my brother would howl like a Dingo. Tiger would tell us the dingoes were just outside his hut.

He had a sort of orchard, but mostly bush lemons and Seville oranges for which there were no sale at that time. He had other oranges but just a few. I learnt one thing from him - how to graft fruit trees. If he asked you to help him do something, if you had nothing to do of your own, you always helped him, as he was supposed to be dangerous if riled. I don't know what it was, but we had a cat. Whenever he turned up at our house, day or night, it would walk back and forward growling continuously. As soon as he went it ceased and laid down and went to sleep.

Tiger used to work at the Sugar Mill in the season. The rest of the year he would do nothing. He used to travel at night time. One day he would be there, the next, where nobody knows, or cared where he had gone. One day he was on the creek, the next in Maryborough.

He told me himself about two men in Maryborough who were supposed to have stripped naked and raced past a couple as they were going along the street. One of them would go around the block and meet the other with his clothes and dress. He said that police had their suspicions, but no proof, so could do nothing. I quite believe it was true. *Part 2 of a serial donated to the Museum.*
