#### It is always a good thing when more than just talk is the outcome of a Community Chat.

Col Bowman, an ex-grazier and forester, is well known for championing issues such as native flora and fauna conservation, youth employment and local agriculture. Mr Bowman voiced his concern about Wide Bay's high youth unemployment statistics (highest in Qld) and the rapidly aging farming industry. Mayor O'Connell reported the council has Green Army projects underway. A request that more programs be applied for was respectfully submitted.

**The Green Army** was designed for young unemployed people, who would work on an environmental program of value to their community and leave with transportable skills. (*Warren Truss MP has just announced round 4 project submissions open. See page 7.- Ed.*)

Mr Bowman also suggested the council sponsor a delegate from this area to **Future Farmers Australia**'s Youth in Ag Summit in Canberra this month.

Councillor Chris Loft pledged part of his budget to orchestrate a delegate attending Future Farmers.

Bauple Progress Association (BPA) wished to thank the councillors, residents and community group reps who attended the Council Community Chat

and advised that confirmatory notes including questions and answers will be published shortly on www.bauple.com. Independent moderator Gordon Dale, indicated that while different views existed, communication is important for the town as a whole. *Gazette*


# Stop and Shop campaign not for the hinterland.

Council has launched the Stop and Shop campaign to attract RVs, caravans and grey nomads into Maryborough and Hervey Bay.

RV travellers have to spend a minimum of \$10 in a local business and show their receipt at the Maryborough or Hervey Bay Visitor Information Centres to obtain a 'Stop and Shop' voucher to stay for up to 20 hours in designated long parking areas.

"Stop and Shop creates an incentive for the RV market to stop and enjoy our attractions and explore our shops in exchange for an overnight stay at designated Stop and Shop rest stops," Councillor Stuart Taylor said.

"We want them to explore the region and stay longer in one of our fantastic local caravan parks." FCRC





### **Down Memory Lane** MY BAUPLE SCHOOL YEARS

I started School at the Bauple State School on January 1938 when the second World War was starting to rumble in Europe.

My mother, two sisters and brother had all been at this school years before I came along.

We had a Headmaster, Mr Rowe and one other teacher, Miss Mateer. She boarded with Mrs McKellar and Miss Gladys McKellar.

I remember we were each given quite a large garden which we had to look after. That suited me as I came from gardening families.

We all walked to school and some children, who lived further out rode horses to school. We had a horse paddock and Forestry plot – Mr Rowe had us clean it up and taught us about growing trees for forests. He also taught us how to find out the height of a tree by laying on the ground. (Years later, when I got married, my husband was looking for big trees for somebody who wanted some for bridge girders. Anyway, he thought that I would be handy, so down I laid and I could not remember anything else about how to measure, which did not go down too good with him.) When I was 7 or 8 the war was getting worse I started to get upset at night I heard airplanes going over at night, (never heard an airplane at night) we had been told. I think at school we had to have trenches dug in case of bombs, especially because of the sugar mill, which at night during the crushing season was lit up like a Christmas tree. I found out later that it was the Americans flying to Townsville to be ready for the Japs.

At Bauple at that time we had soldiers all around us camping everywhere. One Doctor from camp near Bates Sawmill used to come up to our house every so often to treat my mother who had an ulcer on her leg.

Some of the children's fathers had come to school and made a large trench for the children in case of bombing. We had been practising to see if we could all fit in to it. Anyway Mr Rowe's wife had a brother who was in the Australian air force. He said he was flying up Bauple way and on a certain day and time we were to all be in the trench. The day came we were all so excited we could see the plane circling above us. The next day he rang Mr Rowe and told him to make sure that if a plane came over to crouch down and not look up as all he could see was a line of white faces, good job we never had to use it.

### **Tiaro's Sons** THIS MONTH'S SALUTE IS TO **Philip Conrad BERGHOFFER** Regimental No 2778

52nd Battalion, 6th Reinforcement

Philip was born in Gatton 1894 and lived with his parents, Philip and Frederica Berghoffer at Patterson Siding near Theebine, NC Line, Qld. He was a farmer, single and 22, when he enlisted on 28th June 1916. He had been in the Rifle Club Reserves and had previously enlisted and been rejected because he was of German descent.

His AWM Embarkation Roll number 23/69/3 and his unit embarked from Sydney, NSW on board HMAT A40 Ceramic on the 7th Oct 1616.

Rank on enlistment was Private, he died of wounds 30th September 1917 at Ypres Belgium at the age of 22(?). He was buried at Ypres Reservoir Cemetery (Plot1, Row H, Grave No 14) Belgium.

Australian Roll of Honour 154. He also gained the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. LEST WE FORGET

#### **GUTCHY BRIDGE UPDATE** Phil Truscott reported that ECRC

### **NETHERBY ROAD REPAIRS**

For a fair while now I have been driving on Netherby Road and noted the small





section that seemed like, if you're impatient like me, was taking too long to fix. I am just writing to let you know that Council has just done (*see photo*) minor repairs to flood damaged section of Netherby Road until major repairs can be undertaken next year.

The road was damaged when Cyclone Marcia hit the coast in February 2015. The restoration project has been approved by the Queensland reconstruction Authority. Council is having designs prepared for all approved roads repairs. This is a time consuming process and designs are anticipated to be ready for construction in late September.

The next step is tender the approved works and engage a contractor to undertake the restoration works - potentially a contractor will not be able to commence work until late this year with the works not finishing until next year. It is a long process, but it has to be followed to ensure that Council is eligible for the available funding. *Cr Phil Truscott.* 

### Historic Baddow House will soon open its doors

Baddow House was built in 1883 for Maryborough pioneers Edgar and Maria Aldridge. "It really is a rags-to-riches story; neither of them were born into wealth and Maria actually arrived in the colonies as a convict," Cr Seymour said. "The house was designed by architect Willoughby Powell and constructed by builder Fritz Kinne. "Both Powell and Kinne were highly respected in the colony for their skills," Cr Seymour said.

"Baddow House will be open from 10am to 4pm on Saturday, Sept 26. Maryb'h Open House (26 & 27 September) will feature more than 36 heritage buildings as well as 17 private gardens. *FCRC*

gramme are now open. "We want local people to join the Green Army and work on local projects in our region. I also encourage local groups to come forward with ideas for Green Army projects,"Mr Truss said.

"Community organisations, Landcare groups, natural resource management organisations, environment groups, Indigenous organisations, local councils and others can now nominate for new Green Army projects that have a clear focus on environmental conservation or National or World Heritage places."

"For young people aged between 17 and 24 in the Wide Bay region, joining the Green Army is an opportunity for paid work, while receiving practical experience and training in land management and environmental conservation. "Placements in Green Army projects

run for 20-26 weeks and young people may gain certificate 1 or 2 qualifications during the course of their placement.

"The Green Army encourages practical action to support local environment and conservation projects and will provide training to 15,000 young Australians by 2018," Mr Truss said.



### **QCWA Cooking Comp** a tasty success!

May we offer our congratulations to the **Tiaro Farming & Lifestyle Field Day** Committee for a very successful day. (July 18th) As this was the first time that a Cooking Competition has been held at the Field Day we were really testing the waters because in the past we have usually had a Food stall.

On the day we received 43 entries in the various sections. The most popular cakes were the Boiled Fruit Cake and the Children's Under 12 Patty Cakes. Both sections had 9 entries. The Chutney class also had 9 entries, and we received entries from some gentlemen! In fact, between them they took home 3 first prizes. A new section to the cooking was using a Slow Cooker to cook your cake and this was judged by Simon Christie, husband of Paulane who has written a recipe book just for Slow Cooking. 
