Bauple Independent Public Survey gives everyone a chance to have their say.

Between September 7-11th, a survey form will be delivered by post to houses and businesses in Bauple, Forest View and Talegalla Weir. The objective is to enable the whole community to have a voice. The Survey is completely anonymous, but randomly numbered to prevent duplication. The survey seeks the opinion of over 400 households not just those with the loudest voice.

What is important? The Survey is very short, addresses current issues and offers residents the chance to add their

own opinion and rank their comments. Tourism, Roads, Growth... If the township is to grow and safeguard its future, it is inevitable that the RV site will need to increase far more in size, if not with the present council then with a later incoming Council...

Should we be asking the Government to give the same financial incentives to encourage people to come and live in this area as they do in Hervey Bay? Should we be asking for an upgrade to the Bauple to Coast road?

The survey is the first part, the easy part; what do we collectively need, and want. The second part will be the hard part; how do we achieve it?

The survey is financed and distributed by Michael Grounds who is considering standing for Council in Division 2 and knows how productive small communities can be if everyone's voice is heard. Cassy wrote about the family property and the hard work by her father gone into developing a stud and the sadness of her parents' decision to unload 600 breeders from the property— 'she felt tears running down her face like a river'. She looked at her dad and he to had a single tear running down his cheek as the trucks start to move off. They watched as they got smaller the heart wrenching sounds of cows and remaining calves calling each other. I write this because we, with many other hinterland farmers, had to unload our breeders in the last drought. We sent 12 fertile Santas and calves to the markets - a small token of drought management compared to the Cassy's - but the emotions were just the same as we loaded. I am sure that others relate.

Tiaro's Sons

George William GREEN

Regimental No 6970. Roll # 23/26/4 9th Battalion, 23rd Reinforcement

George was born in Mount Bauple (Rossendale) 5 August 1892, attended the Raby State School and was living with his parents George & Florence (Phillips) Green when he enlisted on the 4th May 1916.

At the time of embarkation he stated he was a single farmer in Bauple, aged 23. His unit embarked from Brisbane on board HMAT A55 Kyarra 17 Nov 1916. George was killed in action on 10th August 1918 in France at the age of 26. His place of burial is: Heath Cemetary (Plot 1V, Row 1, Grave No 17) Harbonnieres France. His War Service was on the Western Front and he gained the British War Medal and Victory Medal.

Down Memory Lane Battle of the Bands

They say 'History repeats itself', well, it would appear that Bauple has scored another double on the love triangle. I found this by accident in a newspaper cutting around the 1980's:

"The Bauple Band Hall, the venue of many concerts in the heyday of Brass bands, is taking on a new lease of life. The original hall was built in 1925 by the Bauple Band. The band broke up in 1934. After that time the committee continued to manage the hall..."

"The hall was built as a venue for concerts and before this hall came into being, the bands played in the Bauple Recreation Ground pavilion. The Bauple Band was formed by Rob Mike about 1917."

Top Composers & Arrangers.

"A former conductor of the Band, Mr Alex Connors of Maryborough, said one of Australia's greatest band composers and arrangers was Charlie Trussell... Another great was Bill Ryder who conducted the Rossendale Band—a breakaway group formed in 1922. The Rosendale band was formed after a disagreement between Trussell and Mike which resulted in (Rob) Mike forming his own band. Mr Connors said it was extraordinary that 2 of Australia's greatest bandsmen were living in the small town of Bauple and yet competed against one another."

"In 1925 Rossendale Band won the state championship by the biggest margin in band history...The band produced 3 Australian champions, Alex Conners, Bill Nicoli and Morrie Connors."

"In 1930 the Rossendale Band amalgamated with the Bauple Band and the

group retained the Bauple Band name. ...Mr Connors conducted the band from 1922-1934."

Division & Reformation

Historically, Bauple has had its rifts before, but the good news is that they reunited. There is hope for healing divisions.


The underlying problem we have (lack of infrastructure for RVs) needs to be addressed – NOT talking about it is not going to make it go away.

Essentially, Council took away opportunity for our museum and other community groups including the Bauple Band Hall and the Bauple Rec Grounds. This was done contrary to and in spite of public opinion. Council formed the BPA to consolidate public opinion, but they wouldn't listen to them either. Now they undermine the BPA and want silence on the topic in an effort to reshuffle public opinion. Guess what? It is still the same as the original petitions.

I would like us to all consider burying the hatchet. Bauple had a magical history of volunteers that built the town-from the Recreation Ground and facilities, [Read our story on the history of the Recreation Ground, Sept. 2011], to the Band Hall and Museum. Today, volunteers continue to maintain the Grounds, Hall and the Museum.

I, as a newcomer to the area of 25+ years, miss the old days of Bauple when we could get the weekend papers, the lawn mower fuel and an ice cream, burger or chips. I keep saying to myself, 'Why did the council take those rights away from me without listening to input from the Museum or local businesses?'

Some residents say words about the shop and fuel stop, but I, like many residents, do not care who owns or operates such, all we want is the goods. Oh, by the way, could somebody tell me why the Rec Ground was closed down in the first place? It seems a lot of our rates have been used to close it, but why????? I feel sorry for the pioneer volunteers that built Bauple, I am sure they never expected this. *Trevor Keightley* 41292504



Sewer Debate DeepensMaryborough MP Bruce Saunders'

Maryborough MP Bruce Saunders' pre-election commitment to sewer the outlying areas of his electorate now appears very selective.

"Third World sewerage conditions affecting community health at Howard and Torbanlea should be improved before the Council spends \$52 million on a sports precinct", he recently thundered.

Well, the communities of Tiaro, the Great Sandy Strait coastal villages including Maroom, Boonaroo and Tuan, and other "outlying areas of his electorate" would certainly agree with him.

President of the Tiaro and District Chamber of Commerce, Darryl Stewart also agrees and cautions Mr. Saunders about playing local politics with his constituents."The towns of Tiaro and the Great Sandy Coast and other villages in the electorate of Maryborough do not even have any sewerage. This is almost inconceivable in a first world country

well into the twenty first century".

"Fraser Coast Regional Council have told us that sewerage for Tiaro and the coastal towns is not on the planning or budget horizon at least up to 2031 and that it would be expensive," said Mr. Stewart. "I guarantee that it will be far more expensive after 2031," he said. "In the meantime, our regional residents are forced to exist with "third world" facilities while their taxes are used to supply millions in aid monies to many "third world" countries all over the planet for construction of, and improvement in, sewerage facilities."

"When are all levels of government going to realise that providing the means for rural and regional communities to grow is a no-brainer with easily measurable economic, environmental and social sustainability outcomes being the inevitable result", said Mr. Stewart. "Our vital regional areas will not, and can not, grow without Council and higher levels of government support.

One could be excused for thinking that sewerage disposal systems for our regional towns and villages is far more worthy of Council support than most of the recently announced 5 year Council priority projects, including a white elephant, unsupported sports precinct at the wrong end of a cul-de-sac."

"We are happy to meet Mr. Saunders and any other representatives of governments to plan for the provision of sustainable sewerage systems and treatment plants throughout the Fraser Coast regional areas to move towards a sustainable future within our internationally recognised Great Sandy Biosphere", he said. "In fact, we challenge all levels of government to immediately form a public action group, including community representatives, with the task of delivering sustainable sewerage systems to regional Fraser Coast by 2025. POLICE TALK

Noise complaints: Contrary to popular belief noise complaints can be reported at any time to police. In Qld there is specific legislation regarding noise produced by musical instruments, electrically amplified noise, gathering of persons, and motorbikes on private property and there are no time limits placed on these activities. When police receive a noise complaint they will attend, and taking into the circumstances, make an evaluation regarding what is reasonable. Police have the power to enter a property where noise is being emitted from, require a person's name, and issue a noise abatement direction if the noise is deemed unreasonable. An individual that is issued a direction may be charged if that direction is breached and police can seize the item making the noise such as a stereo or motorbike. This month you may have seen the advertising of **Řoad Šafety Week**. This is to promote road safety throughout Queensland. Along with education and awareness measures police have been tasked with additional patrols of our main highways in order to get the message across about the Fatal Five: Speed, Fatigue, Seatbelts, Drink Driving, and Inattention. GPS Distress

Local resident, Col Bowman reiterates the need for updated emergency information for both locals and service organisations.

"In recent years we have had problems when the Ambulance Transport Service uses satellite navigation devices to locate patients in our area – and the consequent delay in the arrival of medical aid," he said.

The emergency services call the hour immediately after the medical incident as the 'Golden Hour' being vital to the outcome for the patient.

A particular problem is Ambulances sent from Gympie are told to turn into Molteno Road to get to Bauple Forest when in fact it is a dead end road, the vehicle has to turn back with loss of valuable time. There has been other reports in other areas where inaccurate data has delayed the arrival of medical aid and approaches to authorities has not yet overcome this problem.

Ambulance officers suggest to ensure you have your property address plainly numbered and when you call for an ambulance tell them the most direct and quickest route to your property.

This problem not only affects emergency vehicles but also family members, tourists and visitors to our region.

Mr Bowman stressed the need for locals to be aware of first aid procedures, helicopter landing sites and have personal disaster and evacuation plans. *C.Bowman*




