Being Prepared, Weather or Not!

The Bureau of Meterology gave a presentation of forecasts for the storm season at Maryborough on 17 November. Here are some of the points made.

• The El Niño is projected to continue until at least autumn 2016. This El Niño is in comparison with similar events of 1982-1983 and

1997-1998. This projects that there are warmer days and nights ahead. Low chances of being a lower wet season than normal.

- Because it is El Niño, it does not mean that the prospects of cyclones are not a factor. It is predicted that at least four (4) cyclones will form with at least one (1) to make landfall on the Queensland coast. Obviously where that landfall impact will be is unknown.
- Offshore cyclones (that remain offshore) can still cause issue with the coastal belt such as strong winds or possibly storm surges.
- Severe thunderstorms are a very real prospect and there has been plenty of recent evidence of that. There are also unpredictable and often generate with very little notice. Damaging winds can be a syndrome in an El Niño
- Because of the usual heatwave conditions in El Niño the bushfire rating remains high and is continuing. This is more likely and this also means that the prospect of drought remain more likely.
- Flood/s are still a possibility and everyone realises that floods are a possibility every year.
- Everyone is encouraged to be prepared and to be alert to weather forecasts. Irrespective of an El Niño period, we are in the 'storm/cyclone season' which is

generally acknowledged to commence on 1 November each year until the end of April the following year. Some short issues of being prepared are:-

- Check your gutters
- Check roof for any loose sections
- Trim trees around your house
- Check your insurance policy
- Secure outdoor furniture
- Be prepared to evacuate (ie. have an evacuation kit)
- "If it's flooded forget it"
- Be alert to all aspects of the media (includes social media). Follow the Council Disaster Management Facebook page, for example.

George Kajewski

Private #4637. 47th Australian Infantry Battalion. Australian Army


George was born 10 December, 1895 at Ma Ma Creek, Gatton Queensland and attended Ma Ma Creek School. His parents were Carl and Elizabeth Kajewski (nee Naumann). He had 3 siblings when his mother died in childbirth at Ma Ma Creek. George was only 2 1/2 years old. His father remarried in 1899. He and Marie Wacker had 6 more children. They moved to Gundiah area prior to 1908.

A member of the Church of England, George was single, a labourer and his address was Pialba when he embarked at the age of 20.

George enlisted 15 November 1915, naming Mrs Carl Kajewski of Gundiah, as next of kin. His unit embarked from Brisbane Queensland, Roll no 23/32/2, on board HMAT A62 Wandilla on the 31st Jan 1916.

George was killed in action at (Hooge Crater) Messines, Belgium at age 21 on 7 June 2017 and buried at Strand Military Cemetery, (Plot V, Row B, Grave No 9) Ploegsteert Belgium, Panel No 143. LEST WE FORGET

Down Memory Lane A Sign!

What a find at the newly heritage-listed Glengarloom Crossing!


One of the very first Queensland town Road Signs has been found.

During a morning walk along the edge of the Mary River we spotted a corner of an object sticking out of the old roadway. We grabbed a stick and dug it out. It was a piece of an old sign (wow) so we dug some more and found more pieces. We placed the sign together as it was all there and the sign reads - TO' GUN-DIAH with a gloved hand pointing in the direction of Gundiah! The sign was found at the T-intersection of where the old Crossing Glengarloom was built across the Mary River on the eastern side. I wonder if it pointed south along the river flat to Browns Ridge Road via the school to Gundiah or did someone use it as a hot plate to cook a fish on and left it there.

What we do know is that the Glengarloom Crossing is on a map kept by the State dated 1875, and shows as Rocky Crossing. On the western side of the river. Another map shows the roadways and one is called a very old track/road which we know today as the National Trial. With further investigations this was one of the first main entrances from the west over the Mary River to Tiaro, and would have been crossed or used at low tide, depending on the fresh. A bridge was built around 1892 but was washed away in the 1893 floods along with the old Tiaro first siting/settlement, so everyone had to resort back to using the old Glengarloom Crossing again until another bridge was built and opened in 1932. This is the bridge we use today travelling to Teebar, Mungar etc. on the western side of the Mary River.

Enough of history now. The Glengar-loom Crossing is now heritage listed, and the public road to access remains open after an attempt by others to close. And, about the sign, we had Olds Engineering in Maryborough recast it. Anyone wishing to purchase one can contact Olds Engineering.





Green Army WANTS YOU

A new Green Army project in Gympie is seeking enthusiastic 17-24 year olds to join what is fast becoming the largest-ever team of young Australians supporting environmental action across the country, Federal Member for Wide Bay Warren Truss said.

The new Gympie Green Army project will reduce the sediment load and debris into the Great Sandy Strait through rehabilitation and re-vegetation of the embankments of Deep Creek.

"Green Army participants undertake accredited training, receive an allowance, work towards Certificate I or II qualifications or nationally endorsed skills set to help them prepare for the workforce and improve their career opportunities", Mr Truss said.

Participation is open to Indigenous Australians, school leavers, gap year students, graduates and job seekers aged between 17 and 24 years. Anyone interested in joining the Green Army can apply through the appointed Service Providers at www.environment. gov.au/green-army. Warren Truss MP

Premier turns her back on Qld farmers

Saturday, 28 Nov 2015. Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk turned her back on farmers battling Queensland's worstever drought and on her government's own consultation process.

AgForce General President Grant Maudsley said the moves by the Government to return farmers to the Beattie-era lock-down of vegetation management would stifle food and fibre production and growing demand for high-quality protein.

"This Government announced in Parliament on September 16 that they would convene a round table, including AgForce and green groups to discuss vegetation. The green groups refused to attend, and the Premier has bowed to their pressure.

"To blame farmers for carbon emissions on management of less than 0.2 per cent of Queensland is insulting and shows the Premier isn't focussed on carbon reduction," Mr Maudsley said.

"This is a knee-jerk action when we need stability and proper data to make a correct decision.

"In September, green groups accused a landholder near Augathella of clearing his land illegally. It was investigated by the government and shown to be a false claim." A recent AgForce report shows that vegetation management is occurring responsibly across Queensland. AF
