CANDIDATES BEAT THE CAMPAIGN TRAIL FOR UPCOMING ELECTION.

Election day is nigh and most candidates have been out and about, meeting residents and ratepayers.

In the past month, our Division II candidates have dwindled from 7 to 4, with the remaining candidates available at Tiaro's meeting on Monday 7th March for your interrogation.

The Gazette has included a short bio supplied by the candidates - pages 4 & 5. **BPA Meeting** (Bauple Progress Association) was held at the Bauple Band Hall on 13th February with the candidates for Division 2 and the Mayoral contenders invited to state their case for election. Also on the agenda was an overview of the local survey conducted by Mike Grounds.

Gordon Dale, Anne Maddern and Michael Weekes all promised to listen to their consituents fairly with Gordon Dale being the most charismatic but Anne Maddern had by far the most experience of the three. Michael Weekes was the youngest candidate and most sincere. Phil Truscott was not in

attendance but had held a small public meeting that day at the Band Hall.

Most popular mayoral candidate and the recipient of much applause was Jannean Dean for her no-nonsense and transparent approach – she was well educated in the running of the Council and has been very active in meeting local groups.

Chris Loft gave an interesting and shocking insider's view on failings of the Council and solutions to these problems. His financial knowledge was evident. Greg Schmidt has practical experience and advocates that efficiency is one answer to rate savings. The other mayor candidates were unable to attend.

Make up your own mind. The Gundiah Gazette encourages you to make up your own mind and take advantage of the meeting organised by the Tiaro & Distric Chamber of Commerce on Monday 7th March at the Tiaro Memorial Hall.

Make your vote count. Because of the spread of choice, it is wise to take advantage of preferences by numbering all the boxes in the order that makes you most happy with the outcome.

Still in the discussion is deamalgamation, with many people unhappy with council spending, decisions to not accept petitions and to ignore public opinion. Perhaps the problem is, besides the savings to local ratepayers, the result would be lower pay for councillors... *GG*

26 Feb 2016: Locals were pleased to hear of Federal Member Warren Truss' announcement for \$800,000 to build a concrete floodway on Emerys Bridge Road, near Gundiah.

"The funding for Emerys Bridge Road will be delivered to the Fraser Coast Regional Council," Mr Truss said. "The upgraded concrete floodway on Emerys Bridge Road will be seven metres wide and considerably more durable and flood-resistant than the existing floodway. (The Betterment Fund supports the reconstruction of public infrastructure at a higher standard, enabling it to withstand natural disasters and saving money in the long term.)

Can you remember getting the cane for getting into some mischief from the oldies? Well, it appears the oldies weren't so straight either! From the Museum archives...

The VDC OutHouse Adventure.

The lads were home on leave and went to the local dance on a Saturday night and did a little bit of celebrating. In the early hours of Sunday morning, two of them, Bevan Waldock and Frank Hall, decided to overturn three of the "Thunder Boxes" (outside dunnies) in the township of Bauple.

Well, next morning when the owners went out to pay an early morning visit to the 'throne', they viewed with disbelief the state of their outhouses. Naturally, they were not amused. With no dunny to visit, this caused a big stink – in more ways than one – and the Tiaro police were informed.

They arrived on the scene and the culprits soon owned up to their misdeeds. Under instructions from the long arm

of the law, they began re-erecting the buildings. The boys became known as the members of the V.D.C. On this occasion, however, V.D.C. did not stand for "Volunteer Defence Corps" but "Volunteer Dunny Constructors".

Ailing Pub Run.

Joan Franklin (Vale) recalls her father's story My father, Charlie Franklin, worked as a fireman at the Bauple Sugar Mill. He and his sister, Ellen, purchased a T Model Ford Utility from Hecker's for £40 in 1929.

On one occasion, Joe Prickett, Ted Bryant, Norm Miller and the cook asked Dad to drive them to Tiaro for a keg of ale (Bauple has never had a public bar). Charlie mentioned that the Ford had no headlights but that, if they hurried they should make it back before dark. The four thirsty men offered 2 shillings each for the fuel and off they went.

However, time was forgotten whilst the four men quenched their thirst and Dad tore strips off them. Eventually, they threw the keg in the back and off they went at a hair-raising speed over the corrugated road, Dad with his foot to the floor around Gee's swamp. Ben Hall said, "I heard you coming a mile away, Charlie." To cap off a long story, the rough road had unplugged the keg and all its contents had drained away! - Two gallons of ale!! (Ben Hall probably heard their remarks too, when they discovered the unexpected outcome of their trip to Tiaro).

The Old Water Trick.

A popular trick on outings to Miva Crossing for a picnic, was getting someone to take a bucket out onto the crossing for water to boil the billy and while he was bending over to fill the bucket, he'd be pushed in. My father was one of the main culprits but the others eventually got square with him.

Dad went out one Sunday all done up in his brand new brown woollen suit and it was decided that it was his turn to get the water. It was also his turn to get pushed in. I can still see my father standing their saturated while we watched helpless with laughter as the brand new suit began to shrink... trouser legs rising until eventually they stopped half way between his ankles and his knees.

George was born in Sydney to Roman Catholic parents. He was a carpenter and established himself in Oakey. George was single when he enlisted on the 3rd February 1916 at the age of 41. His AWM Embarkation Roll number was 23/43/4. His Unit embarked from Brisbane on board HMAT A50 Itonus on the 8th Aug 1916.

His previous military service was in the South African war with the Queensland Mounted Rifles.

George died of wounds whilst in France on the 20th April 1917. He was buried at St Server Cemetery Extension, Rouen, France.

For his War Service Western Front, he received British War & Victory Medals. LEST WE FORGET



Changes to Local Laws introduce compulsory desexing

To cut the number of unwanted pets going to pounds and being euthanised, it is now compulsory for cats and dogs to be desexed when they are sold, given away or registered for the first time. The new laws come into force on May, 1, 2016. Council is offering to help owners of unregistered and undesexed cats and dogs. Desex your unregistered cat or dog by the end of April and Council will register it for free - that's free registration until the end of August and cheaper registration fees in future years. While compulsory cat desexing was introduced in 2013, compulsory dog desexing was introduced last year following public consultation. Last year 937 dogs and 476 cats were impounded on the Fraser Coast. Of those 554 were reunited with their owners; 532 were rehomed and 327 were euthanised (112 dogs and 215 cats). www.frasercoast.qld. gov.au/animal-management

New laws for motorists passing cyclists

A law is being trialled in Queensland for 2 years from August 2105 and is a first in Australia. The aim is to improve safety for cyclists on our roads. The law applies to all motor vehicles—including cars, motorcycles, heavy vehicles and public transport vehicles:

Motorists must stay wider of cyclists by giving a minimum of:


- •1m when passing a cyclist in a 60km/h or less speed zone or
- •1.5m where the speed limit is over 60km/h. (*This equates to half a traffic lane Editor*)

Passing a cyclist means that you (as a driver) and the cyclist are travelling in the same direction. *This includes when you are travelling side-by-side in separate lanes on a multi-lane road.* It does not apply if you are travelling in opposite directions, or when you are on the other side of the road to a cyclist.

The passing distance is measured from: The rightmost part of the bicycle, or the person on the bicycle to the leftmost part of the vehicle, or something sticking out from the vehicle (e.g. a side mirror).

The minimum passing distance applies even if the cyclist is riding around an obstacle.

Penalties. As a driver–3 demerit points and a \$353 fine if you do not give the minimum distance when you pass a cyclist. If the matter goes to court, a maximum fine of \$4,712 can apply. *TMR*





Anne Maddern says Bauple Rec Grounds Lease in breach of intended State use.

(Article has been edited. See entire statement on AM's facebook.) The following is my position as a potential Councillor for Division 2 on the current situation of the lease over the Bauple Recreation Reserve. This advice is provided at the request of the Bauple Recreation Ground Association.

[As Member for Maryborough 2012,] I was approached by a number of different people who were unhappy with the lease in place over the Bauple Recreation Grounds....After lengthy and considered investigations by Departmental and Ministerial staff, the advice that I received..[was] that conditions in the lease breached the underlying intent of the Recreation Reserve and was therefore technically not legal. ...Officials were shortly to approach Council with a view to resolving the situation when the election was called.

The current situation as I see it is this:

- •Prior to the implementation of this particular lease, the community in general appeared to have been happy with the management of the recreation grounds.
- •Implementation of this particular lease with its associated conditions resulted in a great deal of community angst, something which is still highly visible, even after quite a number of years.
- •Council may actually be ...technically in breach of State Government Acts.
- •The majority of the community wish to focus on building a solid economic base (as established by a recently carried out survey) which would allow for the establishment of small businesses in Bauple and in particular, reference was made to a neighbourhood shop.
- •Based on various sources of information, it is my belief that the majority of the community are seeking to have an expansion of RV tourism as a way to build and grow the economic base they require and that they perceive that the existing recreation ground lease is hampering that growth.

My proposal, if elected to Council, is to take to Council the following course of action:

- 1. Carry out a detailed review of all the relevant material before the issuing of the current lease, the issuing of the current lease and subsequent to that issue to the current date.
- 2. With information to hand, to work with the community to renegotiate the lease/amend the lease or issue a new lease or leases which would give all of the people most of what they want (noting that it will be impossible to satisfy everyone with everything they want).
- 3. Ensure Council is not in breach of State Government Acts. **The goals:**
- 1. ..A harmonious community ..working towards the growing of the economic base to achieve their aims (including a small shop) in Bauple.
- 2. Council to work with the community to grow the RV tourism in Bauple as an integral part of an overall RV tourism plan for Bauple, Tiaro, Maryborough and Howard.
- 3. ...Significantly increase the numbers of RV sites, ... including signage for such tourism attractions as the Bauple Museum (a really great little museum).
- 4. At the same time noting that RV's are not the only use for the recreation grounds and that all other uses need to be given considered weight in reviewing the lease.
- 5. Communicate widely to the community so that there is a general level of fact based understanding of the processes and outcomes.

This issue cannot be ignored. It has not gone away, it will not go away and it must be addressed in a considered, fair and unbiased independent manner. Anne Maddern
