### Albert Christopher Julius GRAFFUNDER

# 462. 2nd Australian Light Horse Regiment.

Corporal A.C.J.Graffunder appears on both the Bauple and Mackay Honour Boards. We can only assume that he was a local resident or worker prior to his enlistment at Gladstone in August 1914.

Albert Graffunder was born 21st July 1890 in St Helens, Mackay, Queensland to Julius and Sylvia Graffunder. He was a farmer, single and a British Subject when he enlisted in 1914. His Unit embarked from Brisbane, Queensland, on board HMAT A15 Star Of England on 24 September 1914. He was killed in action on the 14 May 1915 in Monash Gully, Gallipoli at the age of 25 years. Albert was buried in Quinn's Post Cemetery, Gallipoli Peninsula, Canakkale Province, Turkey. He had served in Egypt and Gallipoli, was mentioned in dispatches and was awarded the 1914-15 Star, British War Medal & Victory Medal posthumously. LEST WE FORGET



More detail about the Baker family of Bauple continuing from our November 2015 issue:

### FREDERICK BAKER

Englishman, Teacher and Pioneer. Frederick Baker was born on the 1st January 1844 in Milborne Port, Somerset Shire England. His wife, Wilhelmina Charlotte Suhr (Minna) was born 27th February 1847 in Hanover, Germany.

Fredrick and Wilhelmina married on the 12th July 1872 at the parish Church of St. Giles in the Fields, Middlesex, and mainly lived in the London area before immigrating to Australia. Their first child, Max, was born in England - 14th of April 1873.

The arrival of the Sailing ship "Clara" in Morton Bay on the 22nd February 1875, was the beginning of a new life for Frederick (age 30) and Wilhelmina (age 25) and Max (age 1).

**Family.** A month after arriving they gave birth to Edward, and 10 more children followed: Frederick, Elizabeth, Frederick, Edmond John, Alfred, Herbert John, Eveline, John, Alfred, and Ellen.

**Head Teacher.** After arriving in Australia Frederick spent the best part of his life as a head teacher. He took a keen interest in State and Federal politics and was a very strict man.

**Eagle Farm to Tiaro.** His first position as a head teacher in Australia was at Boggy Creek School near **Eagle Farm.** He was then transferred to Harrisborough State School near **Toombul.** In 1887 he was the Head teacher for a small state school at Fernvale near **Ipswich**, sadly this is where third son, Frederick, died after a short illness.

He continued moving from school to school using his firm hand to correct each schools problems. In 1878 till 1880 in was sent to Postman's Ridge State School, near Helidon, **Lockyer**  **Valley** as it was found to be in a very unsatisfactory condition and the attendance was irregular.

In July 1880, Frederick was the head teacher and he also had an assistant teacher to help. **Capalaba** was at that time a half way point for Travellers on the Cobb & Co trip for farmers between from Brisbane and Cleveland. (cont. p4)



(continued from page 3). In August 1983, Frederick was appointed Head teacher at **Southport** School with up to 123 students. He supervised 3 teachers and Wilhelmina was reinstated as an assistant teacher.

In January 1890, he was promoted to a larger school being **Tiaro State School** and was to remain there until Sept. 1900. There were 4 student teachers and up to 150 children in attendance. The school at that time was a two room timber building with a shingle roof. Outside there was a play shed and a big paling fence that divided the boys from the girls, the old school was situated where the present school stands on the hill.


**Life changes.** It was around 1897 that Wilhelmina became ill. It was said that she spent some time in Toowoomba trying to recover, however she became so ill that she died on 30th November, 1897, aged 45.

Frederick was said to have travelled to Germany in connection with Wilhelmina's estate, when he returned he resigned his position from the education department on the 30th September 1900.

**Bauple Farm.** With the growing of sugar cane, such became a viable proposition which Frederick carried successfully for the next 20 years. He was one of the first pioneers to grow sugar in the area. He was surrounded by his large family who also prospered in Bauple.

Frederick became and retired to Brisbane. He died 11th February 1920 at age of 76. Frederick Both and Wilhelmina are buried at the Tiaro Cemetery. Trevor Keightley 41292504

The Green Army team will aim to fence and revegetate priority sites along a 6km section of the river to protect against vehicular and pedestrian access.

# New nbn satellite broadband launched for Wide Bay

2 May 2016. Quality broadband services will be available with nbn's Sky Muster Broadband Service commissioned recently. Warren Truss said this is great news for residents living in regional, remote and hard to connect areas as they can at last gain access to affordable high-speed broadband services.

Offering download speeds of up to 25 Megabits per second (Mbps) and upload speeds of up to 5Mbps, the Sky Muster service will provide equal priority to new customers and current nbn Interim Satellite Service users migrating to Sky Muster. Around 5,000 users per month will be connected in the early months of the rollout before scaling up to 10,000 installations per month later this year.

Homes and businesses will be eligible to connect to the service if they are outside of nbn's fixed line and fixed wireless coverage areas. For more information on eligibility and retailers visit:




