Gundiah Bridge starts

Local company SGQ Civil is set to start work to replace the multi-span timber bridge over Gutchy Creek on Netherby Road, Gundiah, with a single span two-lane concrete bridge and foot-path from Monday, May 30. The first stage of the project includes building a side track across the creek. Once it is operational the old timber bridge will be demolished and replaced. The \$2.2 million project has been funded by the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development Bridges Renewal Programme (\$1,143,667) and Council (\$1,143,667).The new 24.6m bridge will include a 2m wide walk/cycle lane and improvements to the approaches.

"The bridge is a major link between the Fraser Coast and the hinterland," Division Two Councillor Anne Maddern said."Including a separate pedestrian lane will greatly improve the safety of children heading to school, as well as people using the sports oval."

It is anticipated that the project will take 16 weeks to complete, opening in October, weather permitting. FCRC

25 years hard labour

A good size group of well-wishers gathered to send off Trevor & Pauline Keightley after 25 years in the area. The Gazette has included a brief outline of their exploits within the local community. They're off to Dundowran Beach.

1991 - Trevor & Pauline first purchased 'Kerseys' from Clements family. They travelled to Gootchie every weekend while Trevor worked for Bucyrus Erie Company in Brisbane and all over the world. Pauline had a small company -"PollyK" dressmakers in Brisbane.

1997 - Trevor retired and they moved permanently to Gootchie. Pauline continued her dressmaking locally under the PollyK label.

Tiaro Ratepayers. They were first involved with Tiaro Ratepayers... and may have even started that group. Trevor was keeping an eye on the council meetings from day one.

QCWA Pauline joined the QCWA at Gootchie early in the piece. Since 2011, Pauline has been a monthly visitor to

the girls at Petrie Gardens. "We have a lovely time," said Pauline.

Tiaro Community Centre. Trevor made himself busy getting involved with the design and planning of the Community Centre in Tiaro. "That caused a lot of arguments" he said. John Horrocks was mayor. It was officially opened in 2007.

Trevor was then involved with getting the Community Centre running. He was the first president and Pauline was the secretary and treasurer. They organised Garden Competitions, enlarged the Tiaro Arts Festival and instigated the Memory Lane Project. Kenny Stratford, current president of Tiaro Community Centre Inc., said, "They were always involved in everything that was going on, and the Memory Lane Project was very well done."

Landcare. The Keightleys participated in Landcare for a short stay. "We put a dam up the mountain... One thing was wrong - there was drought! Marilyn Connell was heavily involved. (*cont p5*)

Frederick William Buckingham

was born in Guernsey in the Channel Islands on the 3rd December 1881. He and his 2 brothers, Edward (21) and William (19), sailed from London on the RMS ORMUZ on the 12th July 1907 and arrived in Brisbane on the 29th August 1907. Fredrick secured a job as fireman at the Bauple Mill and later became a driver and took the cane train from Bauple to Gundiah where he picked up cane wagons for the mill. He was know as 'Fred Buck'.

On the 18th May 1912 Frederick married Gladys Scott and proceeded to have a large family. They brought up 13 children in a 3 bedroom house on Mill Street, 2 houses west of where the bakery, store and post office used to be. (The house was later owned by Hutchings.) The children tell how, when ordering groceries, they would buy VitaBrits in large cartons, tea in bulk and sugar by the bag.

The children's names are Charlotte, Frederick (Jnr), Edward, Ronald, Clifford, Jean, Frank, Dudley, Kevin, Maureen, Nancy, William and Merle. Whenever

Down Memory Cone: Buckinghams anyone commented on the size of the family Gladys would reply that she married a "Guernsey Bull". Some of the Buckingham boys worked at the Mill and a couple of the girls worked in the Mill's Laboratory.

> Fred was on the Bauple State School Committee and was an active member of the Bauple community.

> William (Fred's bother) enlisted in the Army when WW1 broke out and was killed in France July 29, 1916. Edward married but the family lost contact.

Fred's sons, Pat, Frank, Cliff and Dudley all enlisted in WWII.

Fred retired from the Bauple Sugar Mill in 1939, (aged approx 58) and he and Gladys settled in Maryborough, Fred passed away in 1958 and Gladys in 1961. **Remaining family.** Unfortunately as at January 2005, there were only 4 members of the family living: Maureen, who lives in Townsville; Nancy, who lives in New Zealand; Bill, who lives in Maryborough; Merle, who lives in Hervey Bay. *T Keightley*

RV Parks. The removal of signage for the permit and \$5,000 penalty on the RV parks at Tiaro & Bauple: I put up this motion at the first Council meeting. It was passed unanimously and I am pleased to say that feedback



from residents at Tiaro indicates that the number of RV's now staying at the RV park in Tiaro has increased.

Sports Precinct: A motion was moved to stop the Sports Precinct and I supported this motion based on the mandate I believe we were given at the election (both in terms of Division 2 but also other divisions and significantly in the case of the mayoral election). This motion was lost but a second motion calling for a halt and for a briefing on the background was passed. Part of that motion allows for "ongoing consultation". My concern is that some areas have received little information or opportunity to express an opinion. So if you wish your opinion to be noted, please send an email to the CEO or myself so it can be incorporated as part of the report.

Fraser Coast Opportunities: At the same meeting a decision was taken to split Fraser Coast Opportunities taking the investment attraction part back into Council and leaving tourism, events and some marketing under the current legal structure. A structure of this nature (separate from Council) is required if we are to get funding from the State for tourism. I Investment attraction will become a key focus of Council.

Gundiah Bridge: Work to be completed by October. **Flood mitigation** work Maryborough CBD: While not directly impacting on Division 2, I thought you may be interested to know that this work has commenced. It involves drainage work, work on Adelaide Street and testing. While it will not prevent flooding in all of the inner city area of Maryborough, the majority would have been protected in all except the three largest floods (and certainly the 2013 flood).

Training & budgets: Councillors have been heavily involved in briefings and working on the budget. This first budget for a new Council is very important. Until next time - keep well and stay safe. *Anne Maddern*

"25 years hard labour" - Contined from page 1. Gundiah Community Place. "Before my time, they used to play Cricket at the Gundiah Oval. The Theebine Station building had been moved there by Horrocks. We went to the council and asked them if we could use these facilities. A group of locals got together and we opened up the building and painted it pur-ple. Lyn Thompson, Chris Brady, Kathy McFarlane, Jean Davies and Cathy Blowers were all movers and shakers at that time,"Trevor reported. The president was always that 'meddling Keightley fellow until 2014. Pauline was always the secretary and the organiser!! Trevor said,"Every second weekend we had a social or meeting. There were about 10 families involved. We were good with the grants - we bought air conditioning, pool tables, put in the croquet court and went for countless enjoyable bus adventures: Aussie World, Underwater World, Bird Sanctuary & Bundaberg Rum Distillery Tour, Mt Perry & Paradise Dam, Kingaroy & Wineries, Melbourne Cup, Silent Movies and more."

In 2010 Gundiah Community Place hosted the Australia Day cricket match. For this Trevor got an Australia Day Award for Sportsperson of the Year. This has been an ongoing sore point for Pauline as she organised the entire 'bloody' thing!

Gundiah Gazette. In 2009, Trevor turned his talents to Journalism... He was an early supporter of the Gundiah Gazette and contributed many a 'true story', local history and news item. Pauline was the QCWA correspondent for the Gazette, Glenwood News and Bauple Bulletin. The Gootchie Girls' Gossip got around!



Bauple Museum. Trevor put his hand up around 2012, first as Vice President and then later as President. This meant that Pauline was naturally assigned as Secretary and doer-of-all-things Trevor said to do. They were involved in the Heritage Trail and general business. They are big fans of founder Lillian Coyne, whom Trevor tirelessly teases.

Driver Reviver. "Yes, that was a roster system on the school holidays, organised by Lions. Phil Grimwade, Grace & Terry Tomsett, Val & Ian Brown and others did it with us." **In short, the Keightleys have been a motivating and inspiring force in the community. They have valued the history of the area and the people. They have brought us all together.** *Gazette*

Our soil is a shallow, fragile skin on the Earth's crust containing a diversity of micro-organisms, minerals, carbon and organic matter. Without this fragile skin our land is literally baron, without the ability to sustain people, the environment or community. Similarly, water is the lifeblood of our farms, environment and ultimately, our communities. Without this most precious of resources being available to all there is no opportunity for life. Water is life.

The prospect of resources companies poking around promising investment, jobs, and prosperity for all grabs headlines. All over the world these promises have been shown to be lacking, with the benefits flowing far away from the area of extraction.

Fracking, is a process where a mix of water and toxic chemicals is pumped in to well holes drilled into the ground, often passing though water aquifers on the way. The water and chemicals force the coals seams to fracture and release methane which is collected. Problems of this process include the leaking of methane, toxic water made up of the toxic chemicals and bi-products released from the fracking process itself. Community opposition, when well organised, can and has stopped damaging resource extraction elsewhere. The question I leave you is: will you educate yourselves on the real story of resource extraction, who it really benefits and the toxic legacy which can permanently drain, damage or destroy our water and soil resources, destroy our valuable farmland and ultimately destroy our communities? 




