UK Travelogue. We are on a 7 week holiday in the UK and we have enjoyed beautiful weather! 3 weeks to date with sunshine all the way, and the hottest day on record for 105 years.

The one thing we have noticed is the TRAFFIC. Everywhere's a 'car park', as we say in Australia. The Bruce Highway is nothing, I can assure you, compared to peak hour here.

However, we have enjoyed Mother Nature's countryside, the green fields (note, not called Paddocks), the brilliance of the flowers, bumble bees chasing the pollen... but Autumn is coming.

Last week we toured Kent, staying in lovely traditional B&Bs. Leaving Southampton, we took the coast road to Hythe, Ramsgate, Broadstairs, Margate, Canterbury and back to Southampton; a distance of 560 MILES. The whole area is basically white cliffs... I am sure Pauline enjoyed me singing along with Vera Lynne'The White Cliffs of Dover': It was interesting to see the hundreds of trucks arriving from the continent (EU) to go through Border Control checks. Apparently they often find illegal immigrants.

They now have the problem under control, however, the dangers of serious injury or worse can be seen by the small white crosses (being placed by family members) along the side of roads in Queensland. These remembrances are of young drivers and unfortunately, other innocent people killed in these crashes.

Un-thought-of consequences of this Hooning can be jail-time, large fines and/or compensation for the driver causing this serious injury and damage, plus, the accident insurance can be wiped if alcohol, drugs or illegal mechanical modifications to the vehicle are found to be the cause of the incidents.

Another consequence can be the Police record of the incident and outcome which could prevent this driver applying for a Government job or Australian Passport to travel or work overseas at some time in the future. Tiaro's Sons

Thomas Gifford Robinson

Private 2679, 13th Battalion, 8th Reinforcement, Embarkation Roll 23/30/2. and 45th Australian Infantry Battalion.

Again, we are unsure of this Digger's exact connection with the Tiaro District between 1912 and 1915, and why he is listed on our Honour Roles. Thomas Robinson worked at many different jobs and there was evidence he was in Queensland in 1913...

Thomas Gifford Robinson was the youngest of 6 sons of Captain John Robinson and Jane Moodie of Weisdale, Shetland Islands. He was born January 1892, West Hartlepool, Durham, England.

He left London bound for Australia, arriving in Sydney 18 Jan 1912 at age 20. He worked as a 'trimmer' on the *Suffolk*, sailing from Brisbane to Sydney in Sept 1913.

Thomas worked as a tram guard before enlisting at Liverpool NSW on 16 June 1915. His place of association was Sydney, care of Mrs King, 109 Cromwell St Sydney.

He was assigned to the Reinforcement, 13th Battalion and his unit embarked from Sydney, New South Wales, on board HMAT A54 Runic on 9 August 1915. He transferred to 45th Battalion 3 March 1916 and served in Gallipoli. Thomas spent time in hospital with diaorrhea and pyrexia in Mudros, returning to Alexandria on 3 Jan 1916 before embarking for France. He disembarked at Marsailles 8 June 1916 and was killed in action 6 August 1916. He has no known grave, and is remembered on the Villers-Bretonneux Memorial, Villers-Bretonneux, Picardie,

Down Memory LaneThe first Schools in the Bauple area.


1887 'Mt Bopple'. The first school was the Mt Bopple Provisional School which opened on the 7th February 1887 and was situated on the southern bank of the Redbank creek. It closed in 1933.

1901 'Raby'. Raby State School, No. 966 was established by gazetted notice in Bauple township on 19 September 1900 and opened with 58 enrolments in 1901. (*see pic below.*) By August 13, 1920 a request was submitted for it to be called "Bauple" School was denied because the Mt Bopple Provisional School was only 3 kms north of Raby School.

Nevertheless, on 16 May 1935, after the closure of the Mt Bopple School in 1933, the department of Education changed the name of the township school from "Raby" to "Bauple" State School.

The Anne Report

Greetings friends and welcome to spring! Here are recent Small Community Development matters of note:

Great Response. A meeting was held of representatives of community



organisations in all of our outer communities. I was thrilled by the number who attended and we did have apologies from some unable to send representatives but we will keep them in the loop. It was a good meeting with a sharing of ideas, issues and problems. Minutes were taken. At this stage, I have perused the draft minutes and have made notes of those areas where Council may be able to assist. The next stage is to talk to Council staff and then send out the minutes with actions proposed. There is no point in having a meeting without follow up action, even if it takes some time. The consensus of the group is that there will be a follow up meeting, probably in November.

NBN Towers Approved. At the last Council meeting, Councillors unanimously voted to approve town planning applications for the last three NBN sites in Glenwood. Due to physical constraints of land and development and limitations on NBN technology, it was impossible for the development applications to comply with town planning requirements. It was at that point that Councillors had to determine if the community interest outweighed the non compliance with the town plan (which is there to assist good community development). In this case it was determined by Councillors that the community interest far outweighed the town planning issues which primarily came down to visual amenity. We trust that we have made the right decision for Glenwood.

FCRC Mobile Customer Service. The other motion of note passed at the meeting was for a customer service provision to outlying areas - primarily a specially developed van, to be taken on a regular basis to the various outlying areas and providing such services as information on Council services, projects and brochures, some receipt of payments and logging of general enquiries, mobile second hand book exchange utilising excess books from the libraries and a capacity for community chats. An exact itinerary is yet to be determined and the construction of the van needs to be undertaken. It is my expectation that the service will start early in the new year (to avoid the Christmas break). This is a trial only and it really comes down to "use it or lose it". I am grateful to the Councillors and Council staff for the opportunity to trial this service to our outlying communities.

Holidays. I will be taking leave from 28th September to 15th October - with a view in part to seeing how other communities do things. I believe it is always good to take some thinking time and to look outside of ourselves for fresh ideas.

Independent Rates Review

15 September 2016. Council is looking for a company to undertake an independent review its rates structure.

Finance Portfolio Councillor Rolf Light said, "The primary objective of the review is to develop a simpler and equitable rating structure."

Council collects \$78 million in general rates from 49,871 properties across 33 different general rating categories. It also collects \$67.6 million in water and sewerage charges; \$16.6 million in waste charges and \$4.2 million in other levies and special rates.

"The aim is to have the review completed by November 30, 2016 in time for the 2017/18 budget."

Mayor Loft should be supported for exposing systemic corruption

"The community must get behind Mayor Chris Loft and other Councillors in their push to have allegations of corruption involving previous Councils investigated by the Crime and Misconduct Commission (CCC). It appears there are quite a few people keen to deflect the truth, agitate and steer the community away from having the facts disclosed," Ms Jannean Dean said today.

"It is of the utmost importance that we understand how things operate and I believe it is in our best interests to stop targeting the process or Councillors, as questionable dealings and mirky arrangements have plagued our region for too long."

"I am extremely disappointed in the Queensland State Government. It appears they have done nothing to assist the Mayor and this has given him no choice but to bring the matter to everyone's attention."

"I am also led to believe that the Fraser Coast Regional Council (Council) has not supported the Mayor and nor has it provided staff to assist him in work needed to research serious issues of corruption. If the Council has nothing to hide then it should be supporting our Mayor to undertake his work in cleaning up the region."

"I also urge everyone to exercise calm, stop, listen and be informed properly. We must also exercise patience as this will all take time. I encourage anyone with any information that may assist with the Mayor's investigations to contact either myself or the Mayor."

Who would have thought that the Fraser Coast was a hotbed of political intrigue? What we get to witness is only a fraction of what must be really going on. From my involvement and discussions with many community groups, the cover-up / pay-off is reported to go something like this: do not criticise the council, support who the bureaucracy wants you to support and you will get funding and find your life made easier. Alternatively, if you do criticise council or support the wrong councillors, you will not get funding (if you are a community group), projects approved, or if you are a business you might get lots of council inspections until they find something wrong, permits denied, or roadblocks.

What this does is seriously undermine our democracy, freedom of speech and the faith of the citizens in the many good people who work for our council.

Enter Mayor Loft, who at the last election, promised to do a full review of problems at council and to fix them. Now it is clear to see that the power games going since then have prevented full implementation of this promise but at least he is following though.

I am frustrated that the public doesn't get to know more about what the allegations are, but I do respect that processes need to be followed. It is clear that there are systemic problems within the Fraser Coast Regional Council, and we will never know unless there is a full and independent inquiry into this organisation since inception.

In the mean time, though, the Mayor has my full support for standing up to the power games, deception and influence in politics and bureaucracy in this region. To those sticky ones involved in the cover-up; the more you prevent the truth emerging the more mud will stick to you when it all comes out.




