President of the Bauple and District Historical Society, Phil Jeffs said, "It's such a positive addition to the community." Bauple Museum was originally opened in 2001, is open seven days a week and staffed totally by volunteers. Gundiah's Early Dairy Days

Don Nahrung, thankfully, has collected a treasure of old things in the district. He sent in this story to the Gazette:

"After having organised the historical display for the Dickabram Bridge Centenary in 1986, we decided to build a slab shed to house all our old gear. With this in mind, I decided to canvass the district to see what slabs were available and any more old gear.

I thought Gundiah was a good place to start, so first stop was Ray Wade at 'Ever Green'.

I asked about slabs, but he confessed he had used them all for firewood, but he said his Grandfather's old separator is over at the old house site. Well, it was a horse-gear-driven separator invented by Dr. DeLaval in 1879, the first centrifugal cream separator!

Ray told the story of his Grandfather milking cows by hand, separating the cream off, and churning it into butter that was then stored in a charcoal room under the house. The room consisted of 6 inch wire netting walls filled with charcoal and kept wet – which was quite cool. A carrier (horse and cart) would collect the butter each week and take it to Maryborough to sell.

The old DeLaval Separator was known to be used in 1905 and is quite rare. The only other one known of is in a South Australian museum.

Ray also had the remains of a MeLotte hand-turned separator available 1910,

oak ice chest, wood stove, kero lights and household items. Thanks Ray!

The Wade Family.

"Evergreen" was owned by the Wade family for over 130 years.

Joseph Wade, who was Ray Wade's grandfather, arrived in Maryborough in 1864 from England in the ship Prince Consort, and immediately afterwards proceeded out into the district to engage in pastoral pursuits. The first seven years he spent on Miva, and after that he was engaged in managing one of the out stations of Widgee for about two years. "He then settled down at Evergreen, Gundiah, and had remained there ever since, devoting himself to horse breeding, and dairying."

Joseph Wade died 5 June, 1906. "A most distressing fatality occurred near Brooweena yesterday morning, through which Mr Joseph Wade, Sr., one of our oldest and most widely known district settlers, met with a painfully sudden death. It appears that Mr Wade was visiting his son at Wadeleigh, and at about nine o'clock yesterday was out inspecting some draught horses in company with two of his sons and Mr Geo. Phillips. When the party arrived at a gate, the deceased gentleman

dismounted, and with the bridle hanging lightly on his wrist. Mr Wade went to take something out of his pocket, but hardly had he put his hand in, when the horse drew back, throwing the unfortunate gentleman under its feet, where his chest was badly trampled upon. ...Immediately after the accident he had been removed on a stretcher to the residence of Mr R. Maitland at Westwood, where he breathed his last about two hours and a half after the accident had occurred."

Tiaro's Sons Charles Stockwell

Regimental No 7586, 42nd Battalion

Charles Stockwell, born in the parish of Maryborough in 1895, was a stockman. He enlisted on January 1917, as a single man living with his mother, Mrs C Hedges of Tiaro, near Maryborough.

Mr Stockwell's AWM Embarkation roll no 23/32/3. Rank on enlistment was a Private in the 42nd Battalion. They embarked from Sydney on board HMAT A20 Horoatar on 14th June 1917.

Less than 8 months later Charles was wounded and died on 1 April 1918. He is buried at Etaples Military Cemetery (Plot XXIX, Row A, Grave No 2, France.) At the Australian War Memorial Panel 136. Roll of Honour. He also gained the British War Medal Victory.

The Anne Report

Hello Residents,
Well we are on the rundown to Christmas but Council business continues on - a lot to cover before the Christmas break.



Council Reviews.

Significant reviews are being undertaken in relation to the process of Council business including a review of processes in the town planning section, a review of processes relating to the management and planning for capital works programs and a corporate review of Council. These reviews are being undertaken to ensure that Council is getting "best value" for the ratepayer dollar, providing the best possible service to the rate payer, but also importantly to those investing in our area and providing employment, and that we also provide a safe and enjoyable working environment for Council employees.

Rates Review. The work of the Rates Review Committee is well under way with both written and oral submissions being taken. There will be more oral submissions next week. Significant work is currently under way in terms of modelling various scenarios to test for fairness and equity - noting always that Council still requires a similar amount of gross income from rates to ensure the ongoing provision of services.

Small Communities. A meeting of the Small Community Development Advisory Committee was held last week with representatives from most of the Progress associations. The meeting reviewed the responses from Council to matters raised at the last meeting, raised new matters and shared ideas. Sadly we ran out of time (another meeting booked for the venue) to complete general business. There will be another meeting in February at which time we hope to spend a little time on a presentation showing how other small communities in Australia have promoted their community economically with "outside of the box" ideas.

Budget again. In the early new year, work will begin on next year's budget. **If there is a capital work which is needed in your community, can you please advise me** along with reasons for it to be dealt with in the short term so that I can look to putting it forward for consideration in the budget process for next year.

BAUPLE MUSEUM

Blackbirding & Bauple

From the 1860s, the demand for labour in Queensland, Australia, resulted in blackbirding in the region.

Queensland was a self-governing British colony in north-eastern Australia until 1901, when it became a state of the Commonwealth of Australia. Over a period of 40 years, from the mid-19th century to the early 20th century, traders "recruited" Kanaka labourers for the sugar cane fields of Queensland, from the New Hebrides (now Vanuatu), Papua New Guinea, the Solomon Islands and the Loyalty Islands of New Caledonia as well as Niue.

Regulation: The Queensland government tried to regulate the trade: it required every ship engaged in recruiting labourers from the Pacific islands to carry a person approved by the government to ensure that labourers were willingly recruited and not kidnapped. But, such government observers were often corrupted by bonuses paid for labourers "recruited," or blinded by alcohol, and did little or nothing to prevent

sea-captains from tricking islanders on-board or otherwise engaging in kidnapping with violence.

Joe Melvin, an investigative journalist who, undercover, in 1892 joined the crew of Queensland blackbirding ship Helena, found no instances of intimidation or misrepresentation and concluded that the Islanders recruited did so "willingly and cannily".

The generally coercive recruitment was similar to the press-gangs once employed by the Royal Navy in England. Some 55,000 to 62,500 Kanakas were brought to Australia.

A Blackbirding Ship

The Roderick Dhu was built in Auckland in 1875 by McQuarrie & McCallum N.Z.. She was a wooden Brigantine of 163 tonnage and sailed on 14/5/1875. The Roderick Dhu was employed as a blackbirder. Originally a barquentine, the vessel was well known in the South Sea Islander recruiting trade at the Solomon Islands and New Hebrides (Vanuatu).

The Meninga Family. It was this ship that transported Edward Meninga (the great grandfather of Mal Meninga Queensland and Australian NRL coach) in the late 19th century from the village of Lowital on Tanna Island Vanuatu to Maryborough QLD to work on Fraser Coast cane plantations including those in Bauple.

Something Different To Do Over the School Holidays

Be a tourist in our own local city of Maryborough!

Over the school holidays, tours of the St. Paul's Bell Tower are given for \$5 a person. You get to play music on the bells, like Old MacDonald and London Bridge, and if you are game, go right to the top of the bell tower to view and touch these magnificent 129-year-old bells. They were cast in London on 3rd September 1887 at what is now known as Whitechapel Bell Foundry, brought to Australia in the sailing ship "Eastminster" and landed on the town wharf 31st January 1888. Angel Flight

If you are looking for some good cause to support this Christmas, here is a thought...

What they do. Angel Flight coordinates non-emergency flights for country people travelling to their city medical appointments anywhere in Australia. Angel Flight can also organise ground transport in the city from the airport to their medical facility and back to airport. Angel Flight also transports blood and blood products and medical drugs to country people requiring these items.

All flights are completely free. Patients can access Angel Flight services through their health professional such as a medical practitioner, nurse or social worker. Angel Flight can only accept mission requests from a health professional who can register with Angel Flight quickly and easily online. It generally takes 5-7 working days for an Angel Flight coordinator to organise a flight.

Who are the Angels? All flights are conducted by volunteer pilots in their own aircraft.

Our volunteer pilot's flight credentials exceed the requirements of the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) and all aircraft meet specified CASA and insurance requirements.

Angel Flight is a not-for-profit charity that does not receive any Government funding nor do they fund-raise. 100% of the donations go straight into Angel Flights and the administration of Angel Flights. These donations are used to pay for the fuel used by both the pilots and Earth Angels.
