Armistice Centenary Grants

"Next year, Australians will pause and reflect on the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. Australia's population was less than five million people, yet 416,809 men enlisted, of whom more than 60,000 were killed and 156,000 wounded, gassed, or taken prisoner,"Federal Member for Wide Bay, Llew O'Brien said, encouraging exservice organisations and community groups to submit expressions of interest for funding local commemorative projects to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War in 2018. Funding from \$3,000 to \$50,000 is avail-

able to support local community projects and activities that commemorate the end of the First World War, and remember Australian service men and women from all conflicts.

Expressions of interest should be emailed to Llew.OBrien.MP@aph.gov. au by 5pm on 13 October 2017.

Organisations selected to apply for funding can submit their applications between 11 November 2017 and 28 February 2018.

Leonard Howard Neilson

Gunner, Service Number 20850. WW1 9th & 12th Aust. Field Artillery Brigades.

The Gazette previously published a story Sept 2014 on LH Neilson, but much more has come to light about this 'big' young man from Gundiah since that issue.

Leonard Neilson was born 5 Jan 1896 to Detlef and Rachel Neilson of Mountain View, Gundiah. His father was from Denmark and his mother from England and they had married in Maryborough. Leonard was one of 13 children. His mother died in 1905 when he was 9,

and his father remarried 5 years later. Leonard described himself as a labourer when he enlisted at the age 19 (but claiming he was 21) on 15th November 1915. He was assigned to the 9th Field Artillery Brigade, 33rd Battery as a Gunner. After training he embarked from Sydney on board HIMAT A8 Argyllshire, 11th May 1916, landing in Devonport on 10th July 1916, and then to the battle fields in France on the 6th Jan 1917 and assigned to the 12th Battery in Feb 1917.

Leonard was killed in action in Belgium on the 25th September 1917, aged 21 years. Eyewitness reports said"Len"had been killed by a shell at Zillebeke. The shell had exploded just outside his gun pit and a splinter had taken the top of his head off, killing him instantly. The ground was held.

His fellow soldiers described "Len" as well built, "big in every way". He was fair haired with brown eyes, 146lbs and 5' 9 3/4", although most claimed he was "almost 6 foot".

Leonard Howard Neilson is buried Plot 7 Row A, Grave 16 in The Huts Cemetery Dickebusch Belguim, 3 miles from Ypres. His awards were the British War Medal, Victory Medal, Memorial Plaque and Scroll.

He was reported missing and an enquiry was made into his death late 1917 and confirmation of his death and burial was sent to his father dated 6 October, 1919. Photographs of the grave site were sent with pamphlet, scroll, memorial plaque and medal in 1922. These were but small consolation. LEST WE FORGET





CARDENING TIPS BY KAKEN FAWKE

Well, spring is finally and truly into gear even through the dry conditions we are experiencing. A welcome relief of rain will hopefully be here soon.

Aussie Bees. This month I want to talk about our little Australian native bees. They are stingless and if you look at them long enough you find yourself relaxing. They are here in my nursery all the time dancing and floating about on the flowers. Keeping Australian native bees is a hot topic in Australia mainly for environmentally reasons. Our honeybees have been declining, spurring people on to conserve Australian native bees. These bees are a non intimidating member of the ecosystem. They do produce delicious sugarbag honey in a small quantity but more often or not they are kept mainly for a pollinating source. Some reasons you may want to keep a hive are contributing towards the protection of the species, as forests and trees are being logged even more today destroying their native habitat.

Some of us are allergic to the honeybee stings and find that keeping Native Bees are more beneficial.

Hobby farmers may prefer native bees to pollinate their fruit and nut trees.

A great education for children, to show them first hand how native bees pollinate.

Certain native bees are attracted to plants the pollen of which is contained in tube flowers. They use a method called buzz pollination to access the pollen, vibrating the flower to make pollen spurt out. A static electricity charge then draws the pollen back to cover their bodies. As they move from flower to flower the process is repeated, resulting in correct pollination.

I have just received a colony of native bees in the nursery. They are amazing little creatures; doing their bit to safeguard our native plants; existing and co-evolving with native plant species

for millions of years. If you are interested in native bees why not pop into the nursery and have a peak for yourself. Until next time...

"It is great to be able to hear firsthand what people in our local community are doing" said Mr O'Brien.



Music at Munna Creek

Once again the Munna Creek Hall will come alive and rock to the sounds of the annual 2017 Munna Creek Country Music Festival from Thursday 19th to Sunday 22nd October.

The Music Festival has been an annual event since 2011 with proceeds helping to restore the historic Munna Creek Hall. From a sad state of disrepair about a decade age, the hall has been restored to a community building of which the district can be proud. Future developments are planned and will include completion of hall painting and expansion of sporting facilities.

The Festival has grown substantially over the years with 300 vans camped on the Recreation and School Reserves last year. Many country music lovers arrive early at the beginning of the week, to set up camp and take advantage of the tranquil bush setting which surrounds the hall. They also enjoy the informal music sessions which occur early in the week before the main program begins.

An Ecumenical Church Service is held in the hall on the Sunday before the Festival starts. This is followed by a shared picnic lunch in the hall.

Monday night and Tuesday there is the opportunity for budding entertainers to walk up and perform on the stage in the hall.

Arsenic Poisoning in NT

Lyn Kelman got a call on January 3rd this year, from the Darwin Hospital. Her son Matt said he had been admitted with vomiting, diarrhoea and had collapsed from dehydration.

Intensive Care. Matt was in the intensive care unit for over a month before they diagnosed him with Arsenic poisoning. They had been testing for Diabetes, Leptospirosis, Q Fever and Brucellosis. He also developed shingles, and was placed in isolation. By the time they moved him into Rehab (end of April), he was in a wheel chair as he had no feeling in his hands or legs.

An Arsenic treatment drug sourced from Germany was administered intravenously for 2 weeks and then supplied in tablet form. With no case of Arsenic poisoning ever documented in the NT, the doctors

were perplexed by Matt's paralysis. Matt's business has been running their property "Carmor" and clients were booked for Safaris, so Lyn cooked for a month until they found a permnant cook. John was out chasing the buffalo. In the mean time, they searched for the source of the Arsenic and it was thought that came from the sinkholes that Matt was digging for the cattle. Buffaloes will not drink from troughs, and Matt was in the habit of taking a swig of the water to see if it was salty or brackish. *It would appear Matt's part time activity was 'drinking buffalo under the table'*.

Testing for arsenic will have to wait for the dry season. If the holes contain Arsenic, you can imagine the amount that Matt drank.

Discharged. Matt was discharged from the hospital in early May. He was determined to get back walking, and he has since thrown away the wheelchair and walking aids, although he's a bit wobbly walking in the paddocks. Our spies sent us a photo of him climbing on the truck loading Buffaloes.

The bright side. A lovely lady named Anita, his nurse, is helping Matt, and we all wish them both the best for the future.

Cat registrations to be refunded

Council will refund all cat registrations and infringements paid after October 21, 2014 totalling \$365,000.

"We technically have no legislative power to require our residents to pay for cat registrations. The Council has considered this matter and decided that the right thing to do is to refund the money," Fraser Coast Regional Council CEO Ken Diehm said. Council has also decided that it will no longer require cats to be registered.

"Council will maintain its strong focus on its Responsible Pet Ownership and school-based education programs," Environment Portfolio Councillor David Lewis said. FCRC

Bauple RV opportunities explored

A consultant's report into options to boost the RV facilities in Bauple will be taken to residents of the town for feedback. (*The report available on the council website recommends Bauple Community Shed as the ideal facility for managing and hosting RVs.*) Finding a suitable RV site in Bauple has been the focus of intense debate and investigation.

The benefit of attracting RVs to the region has been highlighted in Maryborough.

"The establishment of the city's second RV parking facility, at the Maryborough Airport, and gaining RV Friendly status has been fantastic for Maryborough," Cr Maddern said.

Feedback from businesses has shown an increase in visitors and the length of time they are staying.

"The Maryborough Military and Colonial Museum reported 60 visitors a month in May, June and July is an increase on usual patronage," Fraser Coast Mayor Chris Loft said. Some visitors were only going to stop overnight but extended their stay for up to five nights to take in the city and its surrounds. "It's not just the tourism industries and cafes that are benefiting," the Mayor said. *FCRC*






